This is a draft document subject to updating and revision as additional information becomes available with respect to The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 ("ARRA"). This document is intended to provide an overview of the scope and breadth of the federal ARRA resources available to the State of Illinois.

Billions of dollars in federal ARRA funds are at stake. If Illinois does not act quickly, other States will move to take these dollars away from our state.


The federal ARRA dollars are divided into roughly two categories (1) formula (an existing federal formula drives the amount and recipients of these dollars); and (2) competitive (Illinois must compete against other States and entities for a limited pool of federal dollars subject to criteria established by the federal government).

In addition to the strict federal requirements under either the formula or competitive allocation, ARRA funds are subject to unprecedented oversight, disclosure and accountability requirements (see April 3, 2009 Memo - Initial Implementing Guidance for the ARRA, 60 pp.).

Funding levels indicated within this document are national allocations and Illinois funding levels are highlighted where known.


