

# Illinois Department on Aging

## 98<sup>th</sup> General Assembly Legislation Passed (2013)

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### □ **FY13 Supplemental (HB206)**

- HB206 was signed by Governor Quinn on June 5, 2013. It contains \$142M of supplemental appropriations to pay down the liability for the CCP services line for FY13. This bill will allow for funding through the remainder of the fiscal year and requires service providers to submit all FY13 payments prior to the end of lapse period. Public Act 98-0017.

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- **FY12 Supplemental (HB207)**

- HB207 was signed by Governor Quinn on May 10, 2013. It contains \$173M of supplemental appropriations to pay down the liability for the CCP services line for FY12. All past due bills for FY12 have been remunerated. Public Act 98-0011.

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### □ **FY14 Budget (HB213)**

- The General Assembly created a lump sum operational line for the Department's FY14 budget, and included programs such Adult Protective Services, Ombudsman, BEAM, Home-Delivered Meals, CCP Services and other Older Americans Act programs. Public Act 98-0027.

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- **Budget Implementation(BIMP)  
(SB1329)**
- The BIMP gives The Department authorization for long-term care rebalancing, purchase of services covered by the Community Care Program and Comprehensive Care Coordination and medical payments for CCP not to exceed \$150M. Public Act 98-0024.

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### □ **Adult Protective Services (HB948)**

- HB948 establishes Adult Protective Services Helpline for the purposes of reporting the abuse, neglect, or financial exploitation of an eligible adult 60 and over or persons with disabilities aged 18-59. Public Act 98-0049.

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- **Ageing Billing Authority/Long Term Care Ombudsman Program Expansion (HB1191)**

- There are two important pieces of this legislation:

### **Part I.**

- Amending the Illinois Act on Aging, this legislative proposal allows IDoA statutory authority to charge a fee for conferences, programs, and trainings.

### **Part II.**

- Establishes the expansion of the Long Term Care Ombudsman Program to include adults with disabilities ages 18-59 and individuals who are home or community-based as recipients of advocacy. Public Act 98-0380.
