Abstract

Biographical Information Overview of Interview: Donald Sevenser was born in Flint, Michigan in 1947. He graduated from Flint Central High School in 1965. He earned a bachelor's degree in English from the University of Michigan in 1969 and a master's degree in Journalism from Michigan State University in 1973. His early work was as a journalist in Michigan and later in Illinois, this included state house reporting in Springfield, Illinois. During that time he also did adjunct teaching at both the community college level and four year institutions. In 1987 he joined the Illinois Board of Higher Education, working in the area of communications and in legislative matters. He retired in 2011 from the Board of Higher Education. At the time of the interview he was doing research on the community college system and is anticipating a future release date of a book on the subject.

Sevenser discusses his involvement with Illinois's many community colleges as a journalist, adjunct teacher, and member of the Illinois Board of Higher Education. He has studied the subject thoroughly in the process of writing a book on Illinois's community college history.
