



CONTEST RULES

This year's theme is Lincoln and Baseball. Did you know baseball games were played near the White House during the Civil War? Do you think Abraham and Tad Lincoln cheered their favorite teams? How would your favorite baseball hero look in a beard and stovepipe hat? The 3rd annual ALPLM Art Contest invites you to use your imagination and create a poster featuring Lincoln and baseball.

- Complete the above entry form in full, cut, and attach to the back of the poster entry.
- DEADLINE: All posters must be postmarked by DECEMBER 16, 2016.
- Categories are as follows: Grades K-5, 6-8, and 9-12.
- Artwork must be submitted without folding or bending. Required size: 11"W x 14"H on poster board and portrait orientation.
- Artwork may be done in crayon, ink, paint, colored pencil, or marking pens. Chalk, glitter, or laminated works will not be accepted. (If pencil, make sure it is dark enough to be reproduced.)
- Artwork must be original and two-dimensional. Cannot trace or copy existing art.
- Do not use copyrighted characters (Batman, Shrek, Disney, etc.) or images.
- Posters will be judged on connection to Abraham Lincoln, baseball, creativity and general design.
- Winning posters will be reproduced for display in the Museum.
