Dear Mr. Hahn,

In accordance with the requirements of Section 50-35 of the Illinois Procurement Code, I have reviewed your request received November 12, 2014 and understand the facts to be as follows:

- 1) The Capital Development Board has issued a request for a review and comment on potential conflicts of interest disclosed by subcontractor Baysinger Design Group, Inc.
- 2) The contract pertains to professional design services and construction administration.
- 3) Baysinger Design Group, Inc was selected via contractor-subcontractor agreement.
- 4) The disclosure form submitted on behalf of Baysinger Design Group, Inc indicates the following:
 - a. Shiela Baysinger, 100% owner of Baysinger, is a part time professor at Southern Illinois University at Carbondale, teaching four, three-hour courses for the School of Architecture each year for annual compensation of approximately \$24,000.
- 5) The Capital Development Board confirmed that none of the disclosed individuals were in a position to influence the award of this contract. The Capital Development Board and CPO Hahn indicate that it would be in the best interest of the State to approve this conflict of interest due to the using agency's needs and the value of the contract.

Based on the foregoing, you are requesting my review and comment pursuant to the Illinois Procurement Code.

Review and Comment

After careful review of the documentation provided, I do not view the relationships disclosed above as creating a conflict of interest sufficient to preclude the Capital Development Board from entering into a contract with Baysinger Design Group, Inc for the services outlined in your letter received November 12, 2014.
