In accordance with the requirements of Section 50-35 of the Illinois Procurement Code, I have reviewed your request received February 26, 2013 and understand the facts to be as follows:


- 1) Illinois Department of Transportation has issued a request for a review and comment on potential conflicts of interest disclosed by Ernst & Young Infrastructure Advisors, LLC.
- 2) The contract pertains to Engineering Services to the Department for the Illiana Corridor Project for work in Illinois and Indiana.
- 3) Ernst & Young Infrastructure Advisors, LLC was selected using RFP.
- 4) The disclosure form submitted on behalf of Ernst & Young Infrastructure Advisors, LLC indicates the following:
  - a. Kyle R. Cannon has disclosed his step-father, Kevin Zeeb, is employed by the Illinois State Police.
  - b. Mark Gargula has disclosed his wife, Nancy Gargula, is an employee of the US Department of Justice as US Trustee for Regions 10 and 13.
  - c. Tadd Ingles has disclosed this father, G. Michael Ingles, is an elected board member of Livingston County in Illinois.
  - d. Jerry R. DeVault has disclosed his wife, Karen S. DeVault, was elected in a general election to the Saint Charles, Illinois Public Library Board.
  - e. Dan Thibault, who is a Partner at Ernst & Young, LLP has disclosed he is a registered lobbyist in the State of Illinois.
- 5) Illinois Department of Transportation confirmed that none of the disclosed individuals were in a position to influence the award of this contract. Project #12001 covers Engineering services to the Department for the Illiana Corridor Project for work in Illinois and Indiana. Services in this RFP will be performed in a manner that addresses the bi-state nature of the project, including the potential for differing legal, financial, and technical requirements. These services may include, but are not limited to: determining the appropriate procurement method for implementing the Illiana Corridor project as a Public Private Partnership, developing the procurement process and documents including the RFQ and RFP, reviewing and evaluating submittals by potential bidders and participating in the development, negotiations and execution of agreements and contracts. The term or period of this contract shall be five (5) years with one renewal period of up to five (5) years.

This project was issued November 14, 2012. The estimated fee for this consultant agreement is \$15 Million. Work will be paid on amount of hours worked, but the upper limit of the estimated fee is \$15 Million, with man hours for the tasks to be negotiated.

The Prime Vendor for this Contract is Parsons Brinckerhoff (PB). PB intends to utilize several sub-contractors. They are:

PB is owned by Balfour Beatty Group, Inc., which is a Wholly Owned Subsidiary of Balfour Beatty plc (Balfour Beatty). Balfour Beatty is a UK corporation not traded on an American Stock Exchange. The closest analogue is an American 10K Corporation. As a result, Balfour Beatty has submitted the

UK equivalent of an American 10K, which satisfies its obligations under 50-35 of the Procurement Code. PB has disclosed one of its employees, Diane M. O'Keefe, was previously employed by the Department. Ms. O'Keefe's title is Area Manager-Illinois. For this project Ms. O'Keefe will be the Senior Advisor-IDOT and INDOT Liaison. Prior to accepting employment with PB, Ms. O'Keefe was Regional Engineer for IDOT in the Department's District 1 Office. District 1 for IDOT covers Cook County. Ms. O'Keefe followed the provisions of the Revolving Door Act prior to terminating employment with the Department.






