Re: 50-35 Potential Conflict of Interest, from the March 8, 2013 Letting, Items 24, 27, 28, 99 and 137

Dear Mr. Bill Grunloh,

In accordance with the requirements of Section 50-35 of the Illinois Procurement Code, I have reviewed your request received March 15, 2013 and understand the facts to be as follows:

- 1) The Illinois Department of Transportation has issued a request for a review and comment on potential conflicts of interest disclosed by Illinois Valley Paving.
- 2) The contract pertains to the contract for construction related services in Sangamon, Menard, Mason, Logan, Shelby and Moultrie Counties.
- 3) Illinois Valley Paving was selected using Competitive-Sealed-Bidding.
- 4) The disclosure form submitted on behalf of Illinois Valley Paving indicates the following:
 - a. The Disclosure Form A submitted on behalf of Stephan A. Cullinan, M.D., an individual with an ownership interest and distributive income of more than 60% of the Governor's salary, indicates that Mr. Cullinan is the Chief Medical Officer of Health Professional, Ltd, and a minority shareholder in Correctional Healthcare Companies, Inc. Health Professionals, Ltd. is a health care company that provides medical management services to inmates at various Illinois Department of Corrections facilities statewide. Dr. Cullinan is in no position to influence the competitively sealed bidding process from the position he holds.
- 5) The Illinois Department of Transportation confirmed that none of the disclosed individuals were in a position to influence the award of this contract. The Illinois Department of Transportation and CPO Bill Grunloh indicate that it would be in the best interest of the State to approve this conflict of interest due to the using agency's needs and the value of the contract.

Based on the foregoing, you are requesting my review and comment pursuant to the Illinois Procurement Code.

Review and Comment

After careful review of the documentation provided, I do not view the relationships disclosed above as creating a conflict of interest sufficient to preclude the Illinois Department of Transportation from entering into a contract with Illinois Valley Paving for the services outlined in your letter received March 15, 2013.
