Over the course of a year, Hannah took the time to clear out space and declutter the family home.

“I figured out what’s the best system in the house to utilize space,” Bonecutter said.

Unloading 4 tons of garbage bags, she found it to be therapeutic and extremely helpful.

Through this process, she found a love for organizing, helping others and making lives more efficient, thus Boneclutter was born.

Through the WBDC, Hannah received counseling from Meg Herman (WBDC Director, Entrepreneurial Program).

Hannah also attended Plan for Profit, a comprehensive 12-session training program for startups and emerging businesses.
