During the school year, the program meets at East High School after school for two hours twice weekly; at this time, the program tutors provide individualized tutoring in specific problem areas identified by the school's bi-lingual staff or other teachers, with whom the tutors consult. During the summer, some youth may attend special programming conducted by the Rockford School District; WIA program staff may assist these WIA youth at school. Youth not working or attending summer school meet for three hours once weekly to</p>

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					<p>receive basic skills remediation/enhancement tutoring and work readiness/career exploration activities. Youth may participate in job shadowing activities, internships, and subsidized or unsubsidized work experiences (school year and summer). <u>Counseling/mentoring activities are provided on an on-going basis.</u> The program's career exploration component emphasis is on manufacturing.</p> <p>Youth may be active for an extended time past their high school graduation date as they are searching for employment (assisted by job developer) or attending the Intensive English Program (IEP) through Rock Valley College Adult Education or remedial Reading classes at RVC prior to their going on to occupational training at RVC.</p>

The curriculum that is covered in school as well as material covered in <i>STEMulations</i> is reinforced when program youth receive hands-on experiences applying what they have learned in school to work activities. Students are shown how STEM subjects relate to jobs in one or more of the following industry clusters: manufacturing; health care; transportation;</p>

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					<p>distribution and logistics; information technology; finance; and green technology. Most importantly, youth will be shown that they can succeed in training for jobs in these industries.</p> <p><i>STEMulations</i>, a collaborative effort between Rock Valley College, Boone County high schools and area employers, has three interconnected components. The first component is based on the <i>Upward Bound</i> College Preparation program and will offer participants tutoring, supplemental instruction in academic areas, career and college counseling, mentoring, internships and college visits. The second component is the <i>Upward Bound</i> model's collaborative learning program in which students are formed into work teams that problem-solve: the teams will design/engineer/produce a product and develop manufacturing and marketing plans for the product they invent. The third component is the culmination of the academic and "inventions" component: the teams will work with secondary and post-secondary faculty as they prepare and enter their inventions in various Science Olympiad competitions.</p> <p>During the school year, the program will meet after school twice a week and various Saturdays. During the summer, students will participate in four weeks of academics (Math, Chemistry, Writing and English) while participating in a four-week paid internship with cooperating STEM-based businesses.</p>

They will also attend educational tutoring held at a variety of times throughout the summer.</p>
