# RULES & REGULATIONS

**Films not meeting the following rules and regulations will be immediately disqualified without refund of the entry fee.**

**1. Introduction:** The Illinois Short Film Contest, sponsored by the Illinois Film Office is designed to be an opportunity for Illinois based film makers to showcase their talents. The Contest is designed to foster film production in the state while simultaneously giving filmmakers an opportunity they might otherwise not receive. The format allows for all levels of experience and expertise. Entrants may use any format to present their original story but submissions must be on DVD. All levels of expertise and experience have an equal chance in this competition, so let your creativity flow.

The winning entry will receive a cash prize and premier at the Chicago International Film Festival this fall.

Filmmakers are welcome to submit more than one entry. Resubmissions from last year are discouraged, but not prohibited.

**2. Film Length, Content, Format & Type:** Film entries shall not exceed 15 minutes running time including credits. Participants are welcome to use any format—film, video, graphics, animation—to tell a narrative story, a documentary or free form visual expression of ideas, as long as the submission is suitable for a general audience. The final product must be submitted as a DVD. The entrant must submit three identical DVDs for distribution to judges.

If a technical problem arises when judges attempt to play the DVD, entrant will be notified and have one week to resubmit. Submissions and re-submissions will not be returned, so entrants should keep a copy. Submissions in a foreign language (non-English) are acceptable if subtitled or dubbed in English.

**3. Entrance Fee:** There is a \$25.00 entrance fee payable to the IFP/Chicago due with the entrant's submission. Entry fees are non-refundable.

**4. Eligibility:** The competition is open only to residents of the State of Illinois who are eighteen (18) years of age and older. Additionally all entrants must comply with all the rules and regulations governing the contest, including but not limited to the entry form.

**5. Prizes:** The Winner shall be announced in October, 2013 via personal notification and the Illinois Film Office website. The winner shall receive a cash prize plus the chance to screen their film as part of the Chicago International Film Festival.

Judges decisions are final.

**6. Releases and Copyright:** If your film contains any copyrighted material (music for example) the filmmaker will be responsible for securing the licensing rights. To avoid the expense and difficulty of securing licenses, the Illinois Film Office recommends using only original, non-copyrighted material.

However, if you decide to use copyrighted material, entrants must obtain all necessary licenses and entrants must indemnify and hold harmless the Illinois Film Office from any potential copyright or trademark issues that may arise from the entrant's use of any material in their films. Any violation of these rules may result in the immediate disqualification of or forfeiture of prizes by the entrant.

Submissions made with university or third party funding are welcome, but if someone other than the filmmaker holds the rights to the film, the filmmaker will need to obtain the third party's written permission to submit the film.

**7. Judging:** The panel of judges will be comprised of professional members of the Illinois film industry to review and judge the submissions. If two or more films are rated equally, the judges will decide a tie-breaker. Judges decisions will be final.

**8. Deadline:** All submissions must be postmarked by August 30, 2013. No submissions will be accepted after this date. You may also drop off submissions in person to the Illinois Film Office by 5:00 pm on Friday, August 30, 2013 located at 100 W. Randolph Street, 3-400, Chicago, Illinois 60601.

**DISCLAIMER:** the views expressed in the submissions including the winning entry are not necessarily those of the Illinois Film Office or the judges.
