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# Workload Statistics

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Information in this section reflects Abuse and Neglect investigations accepted and conducted during the fiscal year.

## Explaining Variations Over Time in Indicated Report and Indicated Victim Counts

Important legacy reports contain counts of indicated reports. Investigators ‘indicate’ reports (issue findings of abuse or neglect) when they substantiate the allegations contained in a report of abuse or neglect.

Investigations (reports) however can be retroactively unfounded (the finding of abuse or neglect is withdrawn). The two major contributors are sustained appeals of a finding of abuse or neglect and court mandated unbounding of the investigator’s findings.

Investigations whose findings are reversed (unfounded) on the basis of appeals are low in volume and rarely noticed in retroactive reports counting indicated reports. Appeals apply to just single indicated reports. The count of indicated reports for a certain time period run today or run 3 months from now will be the essentially the same data if only sustained appeals are involved.

However, indicated reports unfounded by court order can run in the thousands. The effect is noticeable. In this instance a court orders that a finding on a specific allegation type be reversed for all such allegations that occurred within a certain period.


Up to this point, mandated unboundings on the basis of court orders has been limited to just allegation 60 – ‘Risk of Harm’. When that allegation is the only indicated allegation in the entire report, the entire report disappears from the count of indicated reports and is counted as unfounded.

Ashley M. and Julie Q. are the two class action suits leading to court orders to unbound indicated reports. During the periods covered by these reports all allegation 60 indicated findings are reversed (unfounded). Findings for allegation 60 for reports outside those periods remain unaffected.

The result is inconsistency in counts of indicated reports across time and inconsistency counting indicated reports within a period at two different times when these court orders are implemented. Trends can be established for total number of reports investigated and numbers of non-risk of harm allegations indicated, just not for indicated reports, for the affected allegation, or indicated victims if the only indicated allegation is that affected allegation.

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Child Death Reports is defined as the total number of child deaths that have been investigated for abuse/neglect based upon a report of suspected child abuse/neglect to the hotline. The child death report contains abuse/neglect indicated, unfounded, and pending count totals. In instances where the alleged perpetrator appeals an indicated finding to the Administrative Hearings Unit and the indicated finding is subsequently overturned resulting in unounding the report, the number is counted in a separate row at the bottom of Table 25.
