**II. Review Health Subcommittee meeting minutes from 3.12.14 (5 min)**

**III. Health Subcommittee Work Group Updates (20 min)**

**Janine**

- Oral Health Work Group
  - IAFC is submitting implementation proposal to the Children's Healthcare Foundation and will be working in North Lawndale, Thornton Township, Pilsen/Little Village, East St Louis, and Williamson County (all innovation zones). They will be piloting a cohort model that will involve trainings (quarterly) and providing technical assistance. IAFC will also be working with FQHCs through in their implementation.
  - ICAAP has now entered its implementation phase of the OH 2014 initiative. Their education module will be presented to ISDS in September. The public health infrastructure work group had a meeting on 3/31 and discussed how to move forward their work through WIC (e.g. developing an online module on dental health). Representatives from WIC have voted to add an online oral health module on WIC.org that is focused on 0-5 and for mothers and caregivers. The work group will be using our energies to support the development of that module with WIC. The second work group will be discussing oral health education for dentists. That group met 2 weeks ago.
  - CCOHF has released their draft oral health message ("Hey watch your mouth: Prevention is easy for oral health") and its 5 step process. Their plan is to release the

message digitally. CCOHF is also seeing feedback on their 0-5 oral health curriculum and will be piloting it with partners in fall 2015

The Oral Health Work Group also began discussing the barriers that early childhood providers face in promoting oral health in order to develop and recommend strategies to reduce those barriers

- Obesity Prevention Work Group
  - The Work Group continued discussion on training for early care and education providers and parents. IAFC share an outline of sensitivity-related trainings currently offered through IAFC (they contract with outside parties to actually conduct the trainings but the curriculum is standard for each).

Current Plan for developing training includes:

- 1) IAFC to continue working on developing a revised training that builds off the City training (will make clear in training to providers what are standards and what is best practice that is not included in DCFS licensing)
- 2) CLOCC developing module on media use and marketing
- 3) Work Group will develop a module for sensitivity training and how to plan structured physical activity (and any others that are needed)
- 4) IAFC will pilot curriculum before we submit training to Gateways to disseminate widely (would need to develop a train the trainer for the new training)

The Work Group also reviewed the Obesity Prevention Matrix and submitted comments via email for Christy to aggregate. The group will also continue to develop their Rule 406 Draft recommendations to DCFS.

#### **IV. Draft Hearing and Vision Screening System Recommendations to IDPH (45 min) Donna/Ginger**

The Hearing and Vision Ad Hoc Work Group presented their recommendations to the Health Subcommittee. Feedback from the group included adding more on the issue of “not screening for the sake of screening but for early detection and intervention”. Also the group would like to see more on parent involvement piece at the beginning of the recommendations.

IDPH comments included recognizing that they see good things highlighted in the recommendations but they foresee some capacity problems/concerns in their implementation. They are concerned about whether statute would need to be changed and the group assures IDPH that these considerations have been addressed and that only policy change would be required (i.e. legislation to change statute will not be needed). The next draft of the recommendations will include a section on feasibility issues for implementation and how the recommendations affect policy and administrative code that govern the hearing and vision screening program at IDPH. The Health Subcommittee will continue to seek and welcome feedback from IDPH on the recommendations and on the implementation considerations.

Donna says that the IL Vision Coalition is positioned and willing to help IDPH with any of the implementation work that comes from the recommendations. The Group assures IDPH that the burden of implementing the recommendations should not all be placed on IDPH and that there are partners that will be willing to help.

IDPH also reports that they are in the process of reorganizing the vision and hearing screening program by integrating it with the newborn hearing program. IDPH hopes to have the reorganization completed by May 1.

**V. Review Draft Early Childhood and Health Glossary (30 minutes) Janine**

The Health Subcommittee wants to create a tool that will help those in the health field understand the early childhood system, and vice versa.

Next steps including developing categories for terms (e.g. 1) Agencies/Statewide resources 2) Early childhood terms for health and 3) Health Terms for Early Childhood). Adam asks meeting participants to also look for terms in the health matrices that were developed to add to glossary. Bryce will be taking the lead on developing the glossary until her internship is over.

**VI. Next Steps (10 minutes) Adam**
