LIST OF ADDITIONAL MEDICAID SERVICES COVERED UNDER PENDING 1115 WAIVER AND STATE PLAN AMENDMENTS

Additional benefit provided under the 1115 Waiver	
Benefit	Target group
Supportive housing services	Individuals with serious mental illness (SMI) who are either at risk of institutionalization or homelessness or currently reside in institutions or permanent supportive housing
Supported employment services	Individuals aged 14 years and up with serious and persistent mental illness (SPMI), SUD, or serious emotional disturbance (SED) needing ongoing support to obtain and maintain a job
Services to ensure successful transitions for justice-involved individuals at the Illinois Department of Corrections (IDOC), Cook County Jail (CCJ), and the Illinois Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ)	Medicaid-eligible IDOC and IDJJ-justice-involved individuals within 30 days of release to the community Cook County detainees not including same-day discharges eligible for managed care not previously enrolled in CountyCare
Medicaid coverage for extended-release injectable naltrexone MAT services for targeted individuals within 30 days pre-release	Medicaid-eligible individuals incarcerated at the Illinois Department of Corrections (IDOC) and Cook County Jail (CCJ) appropriate for MAT therapy within 30 days of release to the community
Short-term residential treatment in an institution for mental diseases (IMD) treating substance use disorder	Individuals with SUD in need of short-term residential treatment as part of a continuum of care
Substance use disorder case management	Individuals with substance use disorders receiving any ASAM treatment level of care but not receiving case management from other sources (e.g., IHHS)
Withdrawal management	Individuals with substance use disorders who meet the medical necessity ASAM criteria for withdrawal management
Recovery coaching for substance use disorder	Individuals who have already initiated recovery and are seeking support for long-term recovery
Short-term residential treatment in a mental health IMD	Individuals with mental health disorders in need of short-term residential treatment as part of a continuum of care

Crisis beds	Individuals who require psychiatric treatment but without sufficiently high or acute needs to require inpatient stay
Intensive in-home services	Families and children with high behavioral health needs and/or SED at risk of transition to higher level of care Limited to children aged 3-21
Respite care	Families and children with high behavioral health needs and/or SED at risk of transition to higher level of care Limited to children aged 3-21

Additional services provided under SPAs 16-0005, 16-0006, and 16-0007	
Benefit	Description
Integrated Assessment and Treatment Planning (16-0005)	A formal information gathering and review process that utilizes a standardized assessment and service planning tool in order to: 1) identify a member's integrated healthcare needs and strengths across all life domains; 2) recommend services needed to ameliorate a member's condition and improve well-being; 3) develop, review, and update an individualized treatment plan that is member-centered
Medication Assisted Treatment (16-0006)	The medical prescription, administration of opioid compounds as a medical adjunct to substance abuse treatment, delivered under the supervision of a physician
Crisis services (16-0007)	Includes crisis intervention, Mobile Crisis Response, and crisis stabilization
Crisis intervention	Includes short-term intervention and referral for persons who, in the course of treatment or intervention, appear to need immediate intensive intervention to achieve crisis symptom reduction and stabilization
Mobile Crisis Response	A mobile, focused, time-limited service, responding to the location of the member, including intensive rehabilitative intervention designed to achieve crisis symptom reduction, stabilization, and restoration of the member to a previous level of function – establishing support for the member's caregiver(s) when applicable – to mitigate a crisis event. Services are tailored to the individual needs of the member and may include face-to-face crisis screening, short-term intervention, crisis safety planning, brief counseling, consultation with other qualified providers to assist with the member's specific crisis, referral and linkage to community services, and, in the event that a member cannot be stabilized in the community, facilitation of a safe transition to a higher level of care
Crisis stabilization	A time-limited, intensive intervention available immediately following an MCR event that requires a demonstrated need for ongoing stabilizing supports. Designed to prevent additional behavioral health crises from occurring by providing strengths-

	based, individualized, direct supports on a one-on-one basis to members in the home or community setting
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
