



## East Moline Prison Receives Money for Repair

A Quad City prison is getting money for some big repairs.

East Moline Correctional Center will receive more than 750 thousand dollars to repair roofing and air conditioning in the prison.

The money comes from Governor Pat Quinn's Illinois Jobs Now! capital program.

Staff said the maintenance work is much needed.

"It's been a few years, the roofs of course have been deteriorating over time because the buildings are old, just within the last couple years," said Warden Mark Williams.

Staff is hoping the repairs will begin this summer.

## Renovations approved for Q.C. facilities

Two Quad City facilities have been granted \$766,000 for renovations.

The East Moline Correctional Center and the Mississippi Rapids Rest Area will benefit from a renovation investment funded by the Illinois Jobs Now! program.

Roofs will be replaced on the Garage/Grounds and Laundry Buildings at the East

Moline Correctional Center. Sterling Commercial Roofing, Inc. was hired for the job costing \$606,600. A Freeport heating and air conditioning company was awarded the ventilation contract, which costs \$44,400.

The Mississippi Rapids Rest Area's wooden walkway rails, deck, supporting wood and concrete structure, and drainage will be repaired or replaced. CPI Midwest, Inc. of Rock Island was hired for the project, which costs \$115, 250.

“State facilities must be repaired and maintained to better serve the public and protect the state's investment in these properties,” said Illinois Governor Pat Quinn. “The projects will also employ a number of construction workers, which will drive local economies forward.”
