Independent Task List – NADCIS Mass Care Operations



The Illinois Emergency Management Agency is seeking stakeholder input from governmental, non-governmental, volunteer, private sector and faith-based organizations to ensure that all jurisdictions are familiar with the planning considerations made during development.






NOTIFICATION/ACTIVATION



DEPLOYMENT

Continue activation of resources and direct assignment to selected facilities, positions and area(s) of operations. Monitor resource requirements and begin deployment for coordination on-site



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N.A.D.C.I.S.

Notification	Time constraint applied from initial realization of an event, or a required action, to notification of key officials, primary and support organizations and responders
Activation	Time constraint applied to the activation or triggering of a resource to/for an approved mission, assignment or pre-positioned area of response
Deployment	Time constraint applied for the duration required for a resource to mobilize and begin movement to an assigned mission, assignment or pre-positioned area of response
Coordination	Time constraint applied to the arrival and coordination of a resource on-scene to establish roles, responsibilities, limitations , capabilities and equipment cross-checks, supply or issue
Implementation	Estimated time a resource can implement and/or carry out an approved mission and/or assignment
Sustainment	Critical elements required for the continued use or application of a resource implementing an approved mission and/or assignment
