OPENING SPEAKERS

JESSE WHITE

Prior to his election as Illinois' 37th Secretary of State, Jesse White served as Cook County Recorder of Deeds and was a member of the Illinois General Assembly for 16 years. In 1959, Secretary White founded the internationally known Jesse White Tumbling Team to serve as a positive alternative for children residing in and around the Chicago area. This year, the team will make more than 1,500 performances throughout the nation.

LUIS TIGERA

A 25-year veteran with the Illinois State Police, Luis C. Tigera is currently transitioning into the position of First Deputy Director. In addition to serving as second-in-command for the 3500-employee agency, Commander Tigera is Chairman of the Board of the Chicago HIDTA (High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area) and a member of the Illinois Terrorism Task Force.

MICHAEL STOUT

Michael R. Stout was named Director of the Illinois Dept. of Transportation (IDOT) Division of Traffic Safety in 2004. Prior to this appointment, he served as the Chairperson of the Illinois Highway Safety Plan Committee and IDOT's Deputy Director of Finance and Administration. Mr. Stout's career began with IDOT in 1978 when he was hired as a transportation analyst.

PANELISTS

Shannon Alderman

Over the past 16 years, Shannon Alderman, currently IDOT Division of Traffic Safety's Impaired Driving Program Coordinator, has worked on or overseen several ground-breaking Illinois initiatives—including the zero-tolerance law and graduated licensing for young drivers.

John Chambers

A longtime sheriff, Illinois Department of Revenue Tax Enforcement Administrator John Chambers began his law enforcement career in 1982. He has served on various law enforcement boards and commissions over the years, including the East Central Illinois Drug Task Force.

Dan Clausner

Daniel Clausner has worked in all three tiers of the liquor industry: retail, distribution, and manufacturing. As Executive Director of the Illinois Licensed Beverage Association—he promotes trade partnerships, membership growth, and lobbying efforts on behalf of industry issues.

Brad Cole

As Carbondale Mayor, Brad Cole sets policy direction for a home rule municipal government that is home to the second largest public university in the state—Southern Illinois University. He was elected the youngest-ever Mayor of the City of Carbondale at the age of 31.

Anne Cox

Anne Cox has worked with a variety of community coalitions and task forces engaged in reducing substance abuse. Currently, Ms. Cox coordinates EUDL (Enforcing Underage Drinking Laws) grant efforts for the Illinois Dept. of Human Services' community health/prevention unit.

Eric Davidson

Currently serving as both Associate Director of Eastern Illinois University Health Service and Project Director of the Illinois Higher Education Center, Eric Davidson has been involved with substance abuse prevention at the higher education level since 1996.

Scott Friedlein

Sgt. Scott Friedlein's 24-year law enforcement career includes the development of a certified alcohol

enforcement training course for Illinois officers. He also specializes in enforcement strategies for college communities, bar security training, and illegal ID training.

Rick Haymaker

Richard Haymaker was named Chief Legal Counsel for the Illinois Liquor Control Commission in January 2008. He previously was Assistant Director for the City of Chicago's Department of Business Affairs and Licensing, where he served as the city's expert on all liquor license related issues.

Jay Keeven

During his 24-year career at the Illinois State Police, Commander Jay Keeven of the Statewide Patrol Support Command has served as District Commander for the Metro East area, Region Commander for Illinois' 41 southernmost counties, and Statewide Investigative Support Commander.

Christina Meads

Christina Meads is a Senior Psychology major who is involved in research concerning alcohol use. Her many academic accomplishments include making the Dean's List every semester at Western Illinois University and earning membership into the Honors College.

Randy Mendenhall

In his role as an Illinois Liquor Control Commission (ILCC) Special Agent, Randy Mendenhall assists with the coordination of the ILCC's underage compliance checks. His 37 years in public service includes several stints as a police chief and deputy sheriff.

Ted Penesis

A government and communications professional for over twenty years, ILCC Education Manager Ted Penesis oversees the State of Illinois' tobacco enforcement operation, alcohol server training program, and underage drinking awareness efforts.

Kris Povlsen

As Director of Prevention at the Ben Gordon Center since 1981, DeKalb Mayor Kris Povlsen has worked with Northern Illinois University on a variety of alcohol and tobacco prevention activities. Prior to becoming Mayor, he served as a DeKalb Alderman for 11 years.

Julia Rietz

The Champaign County State's Attorney since 2004, Julia Rietz began her legal career in 1993 as an

Assistant State's Attorney in the very office she now oversees. Ms. Rietz also teaches Trial Advocacy as an adjunct professor at the University of Illinois College of Law.

Mary Riseling

Mary Riseling has assisted in the development of several successful legislative initiatives—including DUI legislation, the Graduated Driver License law, and the text messaging ban—while working in the Dept. of Programs and Policies for Secretary of State Jesse White.

Jerry Rosen

In addition to serving as Beverage Retailers Alliance of Illinois Executive Director, Gerald M. Rosen serves on the Board of Directors for the National Organization Fetal Alcohol Syndrome, Illinois Chapter, and teaches alcohol-related issues as Adjunct Professor at Roosevelt University.

Lee Roupas

An advocate for responsible sales and service of alcohol throughout Illinois, Lee Roupas is 12-year veteran of the hospitality industry and serves as Manager of the Beverage Alcohol Sellers and Servers Education and Training (BASSET) program for the Illinois Liquor Control Commission.

Andy Sage

Western Illinois University graduate student Andrew Sage was born and raised in Oregon, where he received his undergraduate degree from Linfield College. His many unique learning experiences include studying Marine Biology in Alaska and providing Hurricane Katrina relief in Louisiana.

Stu Shaver

A 25-year veteran of the Illinois State Police (ISP), Captain Stuart Shaver has worked in the ISP's Division of Operations for the past seven years, and is the District 10 Commander. Previously, he served as Deputy Commander at the Illinois State Police Academy.

Mick Wisslead

The success of the Community University Partnership Program, which addresses college-age alcohol issues, is just one example of Macomb Mayor Mick Wisslead's commitment to Western Illinois University and its students. He also serves on the Illinois Municipal League board.
