Appeal of OEIG
Revolving Door
Action

DECISION

This cause is before the Executive Ethics Commission on appellant's revolving door appeal.

On July 10, 2015, appellant received a letter from the Office of the Executive Inspector General for Agencies of the Illinois Governor (OEIG). The letter noted that appellant was subject to the provisions of 5 ILCS 430/5-45(h) and that the OEIG would not consider appellant's application for a determination. The letter also noted that appellant requested to withdraw his application. Appellant denies that he withdrew his application.

Per Section 5-45(g) of the Ethics Act, the Commission has authority to consider certain OEIG determinations related to the revolving door prohibition. 5 ILCS 430/5-45(g). In the present matter, no such determinations have been made by the OEIG. Therefore, the present appeal is not properly before the Commission.

WHEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that appellant's appeal is denied. Appellant should consider working with the agency ethics officer in accordance with 5 ILCS 430/20-23 to obtain proper guidance.
