



On July 21<sup>st</sup> 2010 Governor Pat Quinn announced the State's intention to award more than \$500 million towards mass transit infrastructure statewide, including \$442.7 million to the RTA for capital projects to be implemented by CTA, Metra and Pace for the benefit of public transportation in Northeastern Illinois. These funds represent the initial phase of the *Illinois Jobs Now!* capital program for public transportation, and will address infrastructure maintenance and preservation requirements towards overall capital needs estimated at \$13.8 billion in RTA's recent Capital Asset Inventory.

**Before grant agreements are executed, specific, detailed project descriptions will be agreed upon and included in contracts entered into by IDOT, RTA and the Service Boards.**
