





The program is designed to address various specific levels of play, including physical activities focused on developing fundamental motor tracking and hand-eye coordination.

PROJECT UNIFY®

Special Olympics Project UNIFY® is an all-ages education-based program that strives to activate young people by giving them the tools, skills, dispositions and opportunities to build change and to motivate their schools to have true cultures of inclusiveness. This program helps schools to focus on three major categories: Inclusive Sports, Youth Leadership and Whole School Involvement.

The Special Olympics Healthy Athletes® Program offers health services and information to athletes in need. Its screenings educate athletes on healthy lifestyle choices and identify problems that may need additional follow-up. Special Olympics Illinois currently offers five different health screen programs throughout the state: FUNFitness (physical therapy), Healthy Hearing (audiology), MedFest (sports physical exam), Opening Eyes (vision) and Special Smiles (dentistry). In 2015, 3,889 athletes received screenings.


