2 MS. AVERY: We can get started.

3 Again, I apologize for the delay. Good

4 morning. I am Courtney Avery, the

5 administrator for the Illinois Health

6 Facilities and Services Review Board.

7 Joining me is Dr. James Burden, Review Board

8 member.

9 Our purpose here today is to act

10 as the hearing officer and facilitator for

11 Project No. 11-045, Our Lady of the

12 Resurrection Medical Center, Chicago. As per

13 the rule of the Illinois Health Facilities

14 and Review Board, I would like to read the

15 legal notice into the record.

16 "In accordance with the

17 requirements of the Illinois Health

18 Facilities Planning Act, notice is given of

19 receipt to transfer ownership of an

20 ambulatory surgical treatment center.

21 Project No. 11-045, Belmont and Harlem

22 Surgery Center in Chicago. The applicants

23 are Belmont-Harlem Surgery Center, LLC,

24 Provena Health, Resurrection Healthcare

25 Corporation, and Cana Lakes Healthcare. The

1 applicants propose to transfer Cana Lakes
2 Healthcare Center, ownership of a
3 multispecialty ASTC located at 3101 North Old
4 Harlem Avenue in Chicago. The project costs
5 \$4,838,704.

6 A public hearing is to be held by
7 the Illinois Department of Public Health
8 pursuant to the Illinois Health Facilities
9 Planning Act. The hearing is open to the
10 public and will afford an opportunity for
11 parties with interest to present written
12 and/or verbal comments related to the
13 project. All allegations or assertions
14 should be relevant to need for the proposed
15 project and supported with two copies of
16 documentation or materials that are printed
17 or typed on paper sized eight-and-a-half by
18 11 inches.

19 A public hearing will take place
20 pursuant to Part 1130.910. The hearing is
21 scheduled for August 22, 2010, at 10 a.m. I'm
22 sorry, 2011, at 10 a.m. located at West
23 Belmont Library 3104, Narragansett Avenue,
24 Chicago, Illinois 60634.

25 If you have not done so, please

1 sign in using the appropriate registration
2 forms. The two-speaker registration forms
3 are one for individuals in support of the
4 project, one for individuals that are in
5 opposition of the project.

6 In addition, there is a sign-in
7 sheet for individuals to register their
8 attendance who do not wish to provide
9 testimony.

10 To ensure that the Illinois
11 Facilities and Services Review Board Public
12 hearing protects the privacy and maintains
13 confidentiality of the individual's health
14 information, covered entities as defined by
15 the clearinghouses -- I'm sorry, as defined
16 by the Health Insurance Portability Act of
17 1996, such as facilities, hospital providers,
18 health plans and health care clearinghouses,
19 submitting oral or written testimony that
20 both discloses protected health information
21 of individuals shall have a valid
22 authorization from that individual. The
23 authorization should allow the covered entity
24 to share the individual's protected health
25 information at this hearing.

1 For those of who you came with
2 prepared text of their testimony, you may
3 choose to submit the written testimony
4 without giving an oral presentation.
5 However, if you are giving oral
6 presentations, please be brief as possible,
7 and I ask that you limit your testimony to
8 three minutes. After you have concluded your
9 remarks, please provide us with two copies,
10 if possible.

11 Prior to beginning your remarks,
12 please give the court reporter the spelling
13 of your complete name. Individuals providing
14 oral testimony will be called in accordance
15 with the sign-in, and we will begin with
16 representatives of the applicants at this
17 time. I ask that you hold any questions
18 until all testimony is presented. Thank you.

19 First, we have Sister Patricia Ann
20 Koschalke.

21 SISTER KOSCHALKE: My name is
22 Patricia Koschalke, a member of the Religious
23 Congregation of the Sisters of the Holy
24 Family of Nazareth. I chair the Sponsorship
25 Board and serve on the Board of Directors of

1 Resurrection Health Care. Prior to my Board
2 experience, I served as a Chief Executive
3 Officer of Holy Family Medical Center for 23
4 years where I gained a deep understanding of
5 the health care needs of the communities.

6 I am speaking today on behalf of
7 my congregation, as well as the co-sponsors
8 of Resurrection Health Care, the Sisters of
9 the Resurrection, and the Member Body of
10 Provena Health, the Franciscan Sisters of the
11 Sacred Heart of Mary, the Sisters of the
12 Servants of the Holy Heart of Mary, and the
13 Sisters of Mercy of the Americas.

14 I would like to welcome all of you
15 who have joined us here today and express my
16 sincere appreciation to the Illinois
17 Facilities and Services Planning Board for
18 the conscientious and the hard work done to
19 enable this hearing to take place in a timely
20 and organized fashion.

21 I am representing the five
22 communities of women religious who, in faith
23 and hope, seek the approval of the Illinois
24 Health Facilities and Services Review Board
25 to form a new Catholic health ministry to

1 serve the citizens of Illinois through a
2 merger of Provena Health and Resurrection
3 Health Care Corporation, and our combined
4 hospitals and other care facilities and
5 providers.

6 As individual health systems,
7 Provena Health and Resurrection Health Care
8 have long provided compassionate healing care
9 to those in need. In keeping with the true
10 spirit of the courageous Sisters who came
11 before us, ours have been ministries deeply
12 focused on quality care for all, regardless
13 of one's ability to pay.

14 Now, as we anticipate Health
15 Reform and the sweeping changes that will
16 transform the delivery of care as we have
17 known it, we are keenly aware that the key to
18 sustaining and growing our person-centered
19 mission lies in the enduring partnerships we
20 forge today.

21 Jointly rooted in the traditions
22 of Catholic health care, the new ministry
23 would be distinguished by an ability to
24 deliver quality care across the continuum
25 from a broad and complementary base of

1 leading edge hospitals and also other care
2 locations linked with committed physician
3 networks. From a foundation steeped in
4 shared heritage and set of values, the new
5 ministry would give rise to an enormous
6 potential to truly improve the well being of
7 generations of Illinois residents to come.

8 With a dedicated and talented
9 combined team of nearly 5,000 physicians,
10 both employed and independent, supported by
11 over 22,000 employees, the new ministry will
12 play an important role in the economic
13 vitality of the communities in which we serve
14 through our hospitals and our facilities.
15 Above all, our partnership will remain true
16 to the hallmarks of our Catholic identity,
17 promoting and protecting the dignity of every
18 individual, from conception to death, caring
19 for the poor and vulnerable and properly
20 stewarding our precious people and financial
21 resources.

22 Before I conclude, I would like to
23 also enter into the record a letter of
24 support from His Eminence, Francis Cardinal
25 George, Archbishop of Chicago.

1 In his letter he says, in part,
2 and I quote, "I am grateful for the
3 willingness of our state's premier Catholic
4 providers to collaborate in order to meet the
5 current challenges of health care. As they
6 do now, the combined systems will operate
7 without any restrictive admissions policies
8 related to race, ethnic background, religion,
9 payment source, or any other factor. The new
10 system will continue to admit Medicaid and
11 Medicare recipients and to care for those
12 patients in need of charity care. This
13 merger has my full support."

14 In conclusion, the combination of
15 Provena Health and Resurrection Health Care
16 hospitals and other care facilities and
17 providers will strengthen and expand access
18 to an exceptional tradition of quality care
19 and service millions of Illinois residents
20 who have come to know and depend upon for
21 more than a century. On behalf of the women
22 religious whose communities are sponsoring
23 the applications before you, we ask and
24 request your approval. Thank you.

25 MS. AVERY: Thank you. Next we

1 have Starr Novak.

2 MS. NOVAK: My name is S-T-A-R-R,
3 N-O-V-A-K. Good morning. I'm senior
4 Vice-President of Business Development for
5 Resurrection Health Care, one of
6 Resurrection's executive liaisons to the
7 Belmont-Harlem Ambulatory Surgery Center and
8 assistant secretary of the Center's Board of
9 Directors.

10 The Belmont-Harlem Ambulatory
11 Surgery Center is a limited liability
12 corporation joint venture owned and operated
13 by Resurrection Services, a wholly owned
14 subsidiary of Resurrection Health Care.
15 Resurrection Services retains, at least, 51
16 percent of ownership in the company at all
17 times.

18 Resurrection Health Care
19 Corporation and Provena Health are proposing
20 a merger of the two systems that will better
21 position the combined new system's hospitals,
22 long-term care facilities, outpatient
23 centers, and other programs and facilities to
24 continue to serve the patients and
25 communities that have traditionally looked to

1 those facilities for care. Details on the
2 decision to merge and the structure of the
3 transaction are included in our Certificate
4 of Need applications that were filed in July,
5 2011.

6 After the merger, the
7 Belmont-Harlem Ambulatory Surgery Center will
8 continue to operate as a multispecialty
9 ambulatory surgery treatment center. We do
10 not expect any program, service, or staffing
11 changes to occur as a result of this merger.

12 The current charitable policy of
13 Belmont-Harlem Ambulatory Surgery Center will
14 continue and is included in our CON
15 application. The policy requires all
16 physician investors to provide a certain
17 amount of charitable care to patients as
18 requirement of them attaining their
19 credentials. The Ambulatory Surgery Center
20 then matches any charitable discount. The
21 Ambulatory Surgery Center also encourages
22 physicians, as part of their charitable care
23 commitment, to treat Medicaid patients who
24 offer -- who are often not offered the
25 opportunity to be treated in the Ambulatory

1 Surgery Center setting.

2 In summary, this proposed merger
3 will enable the Center and its current and
4 new sister facilities to strength access to
5 high quality, Catholic Health Care, improve
6 our combined financial viability, enhance
7 clinical capabilities, improve employee and
8 medical staff satisfaction, and, importantly,
9 positions the new health care system for
10 innovation and adaptation under health care
11 reform.

12 Thank you for this opportunity to
13 explain the importance and value to the
14 community of this proposed merger.

15 MS. AVERY: Thank you. Next is
16 Faith McHale.

17 MS. MCHALE: My name is Faith
18 McHale. I am the administrator of the
19 Belmont-Harlem Surgery Center. I was asked
20 by Dr. John Bello to read his testimony,
21 so. . .

22 "Good morning. My name is
23 Dr. John Bello, and I have been Chairman of
24 the Department of Ophthalmology at
25 Resurrection Medical Center since 1994 and an

1 investor and Chairman of the Board of the
2 Belmont-Harlem Ambulatory Center, LLC, since
3 2007.

4 We support the merger of Provena
5 Health and Resurrection Health Care. Our
6 surgery center and our community will benefit
7 from program enhancements and continuation of
8 projects designed to best serve the patient
9 community. Examples include completion of an
10 integrated electronic health record system
11 already underway and anticipated to be
12 implemented system-wide, enhanced
13 physician-hospital integration, more
14 efficient equipment planning, replacement and
15 procurement systems, and expanded material
16 management programs.

17 A combined Resurrection Health
18 Care and Provena Health system will better
19 position the new system to continue to serve
20 the patients and communities that have
21 traditionally looked to these facilities and
22 programs for care. This system merger is
23 intended to preserve and expand access to
24 health care for people in our community,
25 improve financial viability, and improve

1 patient, employee, and medical staff
2 satisfaction through a shared culture and
3 integrated leadership, and position the
4 combined system for innovation and adaptation
5 under health care reform.

6 The current charitable policy of
7 the Belmont-Harlem Ambulatory Surgery Center
8 will continue as is included in our CON
9 application. The policy requires all
10 physician investors to provide a certain
11 amount of charitable care to patients as a
12 requirement of maintaining their credentials.
13 The ASC then matches any charitable discount.
14 The ASC also encourages physicians, as part
15 of their charitable care commitment, to treat
16 Medicaid patients who are often not offered
17 the opportunity to be treated in an ASC
18 setting.

19 On behalf of the Board of
20 Directors, I fully support the Certificate of
21 Need that will bring the Belmont-Harlem
22 Ambulatory Surgery Center into the new system
23 formed by the merger of Provena Health and
24 Resurrection Health Care.

25 Thank you for the opportunity to

1 explain how this merger will impact the
2 center.

3 MS. AVERY: Thank you. For the
4 matter of the process, you're going to speak
5 on behalf of yourself. And then, once you
6 start for everyone else, follow the same.

7 MR. CRAWFORD: Thank you. First
8 of all, my name is Brian Crawford, B-R-I-A-N,
9 C-R-A-W-F-O-R-D, Vice-President of Public
10 Affairs for Resurrection Health Care, and I
11 have a brief testimony that I will submit in
12 writing of my own, but I, particularly, would
13 like to thank Dr. Burden for being with us
14 today and taking time out of his schedule.
15 We appreciate you being here.

16 We are excited to tell you about
17 our plans. I'm going to submit my testimony
18 in writing, and then, again, I'm Brian
19 Crawford and on behalf of David McNaughten,
20 the Commander of the 16th District Chicago
21 Police Department, a letter of support in
22 support of the project that I would like to
23 submit.

24 MS. AVERY: You are just submitting
25 them for the record?

1 MR. CRAWFORD: I'm just submitting
2 them. I'm not going to read them all, if
3 that's okay with the hearing officer. Do you
4 want me to say my name?

5 MS. AVERY: Yes, "On behalf of."

6 MR. CRAWFORD: I'm Brian Crawford,
7 and on behalf of Betty Henneman, Clerk, City
8 of Park Ridge, I have a letter of support for
9 the project.

10 Brian Crawford, on behalf of
11 Dr. Lynn Secara (phonetic), the President
12 Principal of Resurrection College Prep High
13 School. I have a letter of support for the
14 project.

15 Brian Crawford on behalf of
16 Alderwoman Mary O'Connor of the 41st Ward. I
17 have a letter of support for the project.

18 Brian Crawford, on behalf of Peter
19 N. Sylvester, Cook County Commissioner, 9th
20 District I have a letter of support for the
21 project.

22 Brian Crawford on behalf of
23 Reverend James J. O'Brien from sandman
24 Parish. I have a letter of support for the
25 project.

1 Brian Crawford on behalf of Sondra
2 O. Lightfoot, MPH, Regional Director of
3 Health Initiatives and Patient Navigation
4 Services, American Cancer Society, Chicago
5 Region. I have a letter of support for the
6 project.

7 Brian Crawford on behalf of Kevin
8 Stinson, Fire Chief of Norwood Park Fire
9 Protection District. I have a letter of
10 support for the project.

11 Now, these we didn't have forms
12 for, so I have four letters I don't have a
13 form for.

14 MS. AVERY: We will just admit
15 those as letters. Let me ask you a quick
16 question. Are you going to read the letters
17 for those persons or just submit written
18 testimony?

19 MR. CRAWFORD: I will submit them.
20 Then you can read all you have into the
21 record.

22 MR. CRAWFORD: Brian Crawford in
23 behalf of Matthew Tolls (phonetic), Vice-
24 President, PNC Bank. I have a letter of
25 support for the project.

1 Brian Crawford on behalf of
2 Patricia Ahern, President and CEO of Rainbow
3 Hospice and Palliative Care. I have a letter
4 to support the project.

5 Brian Crawford on behalf of Guy R.
6 Wiebking, President and Chief Executive
7 Officer for Provena Health, and Sandra Bruce,
8 President and Chief Executive Officer,
9 Resurrection Health Care, a letter in support
10 of the project.

11 And Brian Crawford on behalf of
12 Marie Birch, a resident of the area, a letter
13 of support for the project.

14 MS. AVERY: Thank you.

15 Is there anyone who wishes to
16 provide testimony who has not had the
17 opportunity do so?

18 Hearing none, is there anyone who
19 has testified who wishes to provide
20 additional testimony?

21 I would like to remind everyone to
22 submit additional written comments to the
23 Illinois Health Facilities and Services
24 Review Board and please note that the project
25 is tentatively considered for the

1 consideration by the state board on October
2 12 and 13 meeting. The meeting location is
3 not yet confirmed. Please refer to the
4 Health Facilities and Services Review Board
5 website at www.hfsrb.Illinois.gov for the
6 meeting location. This information should be
7 posted no later than September 6. The public
8 also has until 9 a.m., September 22, 2011, to
9 submit written comments pertaining to this




