2 MS. AVERY: Good morning again. I'm Courtney
3 Avery, Administrator for the Illinois Health Facilities and
4 Services Review Board and joining me today is Kathy Olson,
5 our Board member, and Karen Keim, court reporter for
6 today's proceeding.

7 Our purpose here today is to conduct a public
8 hearing for Project No. 11-046, Manteno Dialysis Center,
9 Manteno, Illinois.

10 As per the Illinois Health Facilities and
11 Services Review Board rules, I would like to read the legal
12 notice into the record. In accordance with the
13 requirements of the Illinois Health Facilities Planning
14 Act, notice is given of receipt to transfer ownership of an
15 End Stage Renal Dialysis facility, Project No. 11-046,
16 Manteno Dialysis Center in Manteno, Illinois. The
17 applicants are Kankakee Valley Dialysis Network, LLC,
18 Provena Health, Resurrection Health Care Corporation, and
19 Cana Lakes Health Care. The applicants propose to transfer
20 to Cana Lakes Health Care ownership of the ESRD facility,
21 located at 5 East Division Street, Manteno. The cost of
22 the project is \$1,084,288.

23 A public hearing is to be held by the Illinois
24 Department of Public Health pursuant to the Illinois Health

1 Facilities Planning Act. The hearing is open to the public
2 and will afford an opportunity for parties with interest to
3 present written and/or verbal comment relevant to the
4 project. All allegations or assertions should be relevant
5 to the need for the proposed project and be supported with
6 two copies of documentation or materials that are printed
7 or typed on paper sized 8 1/2 x 11.

8 The public hearing will take place pursuant to
9 Part 1130.910. The hearing is scheduled for 1:00 p.m.,
10 September 16th, 2011, located at Leo Hasset Community
11 Center, 211 North Main Street, Manteno, Illinois 60950.

12 If you have not done so, please sign in, using
13 the appropriate registration forms. There are two speaker
14 registration forms, one for individuals in support of the
15 project and one for individuals in opposition of the
16 project. In addition, there is a sign-in sheet for
17 individuals to register attendance who do not wish to
18 provide any testimony.

19 To ensure that the Illinois Health Facilities
20 and Services Review Board's public hearings protect the
21 privacy and maintain the confidentiality of an individual's
22 health information, covered entities as defined by the
23 Health Insurance Portability Act of 1996, such as
24 facilities, hospital providers, health plans, and

1 healthcare clearinghouses, submitting oral or written
2 testimony that discloses protected health information of
3 individuals shall have a valid, written authorization from
4 that individual. The authorization shall allow the covered
5 entity to share the individual's protected health
6 information at this hearing.

7 Those of you who came with prepared text of
8 your testimony may choose to submit the written testimony
9 without giving an oral presentation. However, if you give
10 an oral presentation, please be as brief as possible. I
11 ask that you limit your testimony to three minutes. At the
12 conclusion of your remarks, please provide us with two
13 copies. Prior to beginning your remarks, please give the
14 court reporter the spelling of your complete name.

15 Individuals providing oral testimony will be
16 called in the order according to sign-in. We will begin
17 with representatives from the applicants, and I ask that
18 you hold your questions until all testimony has been
19 presented.

20 And we will start off with Melissa Tanner.

21 For the process, I can say that if you gave
22 the testimony before and you just want to give the written,
23 I can have Karen just copy that, if it's verbatim into this
24 transcript also.

1 MS. TANNER: My name is Melissa Tanner,
2 T-a-n-n-e-r. I am reading the testimony on behalf of
3 Sister Anne Jaeger. Can we just include it?

4 MS. AVERY: The testimony that you're giving
5 will be typed into the transcript, as long as you make the
6 disclaimer at the beginning.

7 MS. TANNER: Okay. Great.

8
9 (FOLLOWING IS THE TESTIMONY PREVIOUSLY PRESENTED BY SISTER
10 ANNE JAEGER:)

11 MS. JAEGER: Good morning, Everyone. My name
12 is Sister Anne Jaeger, and I am a member of the Servants of
13 the Holy Heart of Mary, which is a religious community. I
14 am speaking today on behalf of the member body of Provena
15 Health, which includes the Franciscan Sisters of the Sacred
16 Heart, the Servants of the Holy Heart of Mary, and the
17 Sisters of Mercy of the Americas, and on behalf of the
18 Sponsorship Council of Resurrection Health Care, which
19 includes the Sisters of the Holy Family of Nazareth and the
20 Sisters of the Resurrection.

21 I am very pleased to be here to share with the
22 community an overview of what is a very exciting, new
23 chapter in the history of Provena St. Mary's Hospital and
24 for our health system as a whole. I would also express my

1 sincere appreciation to the Illinois Facilities and
2 Services Review Board for their efforts to enable this
3 hearing to take place in a timely and organized fashion.

4 By way of background, Provena Health is a
5 Catholic health ministry that includes six hospitals,
6 including Provena St. Mary's Hospital, six long-term care
7 and senior residential facilities, numerous clinics, five
8 home health agencies, and other health-related activities
9 operating in Illinois and Indiana. At the encouragement of
10 Joseph Cardinal Bernardin, Provena Health came into being
11 on December 1st, 1997 from a human need to provide
12 exceptional and compassionate healthcare services and to be
13 a sign of hope to all those in the communities we serve.
14 With a mission to build communities of healing and hope by
15 compassionately responding to human need in the spirit of
16 Jesus Christ, we have served our community since our first
17 hospitals opened their doors as early as 1882. From our
18 very beginnings, we have been called to be much more than
19 just a provider of healthcare services. Rather, we are
20 steeped in a culture that is committed to responding to the
21 needs of those we are privileged to serve, delivering high
22 quality care that is accessible to all.

23 Today, I am representing the five communities
24 of women religious, who, in faith and hope, seek the

1 approval of the Illinois Health Facilities and Services
2 Review Board to form a new Catholic health ministry to
3 serve the citizens of Illinois through a merger of Provena
4 Health and Resurrection Healthcare Corporation. As
5 individual health systems, Provena Health and Resurrection
6 Healthcare have long provided compassionate healing to
7 those in need. In keeping with the true spirit of the
8 courageous Sisters who came before us, ours have been
9 ministries deeply focused on quality of care for all,
10 regardless of their ability to pay.

11 Now, as we anticipate health reform and the
12 sweeping changes that will transform the delivery of care
13 as we have come to know it, we are keenly aware that the
14 key to sustaining and growing our person-centered mission
15 lies in the strength of enduring partnerships we forming
16 today. Jointly rooted in the traditions of Catholic
17 healthcare, the new ministry will be distinguished by an
18 ability to deliver quality care across the continuum from a
19 broad and complementary base of leading edge locations and
20 physician networks. From a foundation steeped in a shared
21 heritage and set of values, the new ministry will give rise
22 to an enormous potential to truly improve the well-being of
23 generations of Illinoisans to come.

24 With the dedicated and talented, combined team

1 of nearly 5,000 physicians, supported by over 22,000
2 employees, the new ministry will play an important role in
3 the economic vitality of the communities in which we serve.
4 Above all, our partnership will remain true to the
5 hallmarks of our Catholic identity, promoting and
6 protecting the dignity of every individual from conception
7 until death, caring for the poor and the vulnerable, and
8 properly stewarding our resources of our precious people
9 and financial resources.

10 Finally, I would like to enter into the record
11 a letter of support from His Eminence, Francis Cardinal
12 George, Archbishop of Chicago. In his letter, he says in
13 part, and I quote, "I am grateful for the willingness of
14 our state's premiere Catholic providers to collaborate in
15 order to meet the current challenges of healthcare. As
16 they do now, the combined systems will operate without any
17 restrictive admission policies related to race, ethnic
18 background, religion, payment source, or any other factor.
19 The new system will continue to admit Medicare and Medicaid
20 recipients and to care for those patients in need of
21 charity care. This merger has my full support," end of
22 quote.

23 In conclusion, the combination of Provena
24 Health and Resurrection Healthcare will strengthen and

1 expand access to an exceptional tradition of quality care
2 and service millions of Illinois residents who have come to
3 know and depend upon for more than a century. On behalf of
4 the women religious whose communities are sponsoring the
5 proposal before you, we prayerfully request your approval.

6 God bless you all, and thank you very much.

7

8 MS. AVERY: Amy LaFine.

9 MS. LaFINE: My name is Amy LaFine. I have a
10 written copy of my testimony and the two letters jointly
11 signed by Guy Wiebking and Sandra Bruce I'm submitting.

12 MS. AVERY: Those are the same two from
13 earlier today?

14 MS. LaFINE: Yes.

15 MS. AVERY: So we will incorporate that into
16 the testimony also -- I mean the transcript.

17

18 (FOLLOWING IS THE TESTIMONY PREVIOUSLY PRESENTED BY AMY
19 LaFINE:)

20 MS. LaFINE: Good morning, and thank you for
21 the opportunity to not only share the public -- with the
22 public our goals for what we hope to achieve through the
23 merger between Provena Health and Resurrection Healthcare,
24 but to also describe the benefits of this new partnership

1 to the people of Greater Kankakee community. My name is
2 Amy LaFine and I am the Chief Nursing Executive at Provena
3 St. Mary's Hospital in Kankakee.

4 I am pleased to share testimony on behalf of
5 Michael Arno, our President and Chief Executive Officer. I
6 would like to begin by submitting into the record a letter
7 from Guy Wiebking, the President and Chief Executive
8 Officer of Provena Health, and Sandra Bruce, the President
9 and Chief Executive Officer of Resurrection Health, which
10 states in part, "The size and scope of the new ministry
11 will improve financial viability through a new structure
12 that focuses on savings in corporate and administrative
13 costs, while concentrating resources on our local
14 healthcare ministries where care is provided."

15 Concentrating resources in our local
16 healthcare ministries where care is provided. I would like
17 to assure the Board and our community that our leaders get
18 it. They know that success in healthcare is not derived
19 from a big, corporate overhead, but rather by investing and
20 caring for people in the communities in which we are
21 privileged to serve.

22 For local hospitals like Provena St. Mary's,
23 there are a number of excellent benefits to being part of
24 the health system, and especially one that will be the

1 largest in our state. As a member of Provena Health, our
2 local hospital in Kankakee, and ultimately our patients and
3 employees, have time and again benefited from the system's
4 "Think Global Act Local" approach. From technological
5 enhancements that improve quality in patient safety,
6 leading-edge diagnostics, to patient and family-centered
7 renovations and new programs, our local hospital ministries
8 have grown in ways we never could have without the support
9 and resources of a greater system.

10 As healthcare faces unprecedented changes, as
11 we confront decreased reimbursements, as the need for
12 charity care and financial assistance becomes greater than
13 ever, and as our aging populations test the systems as
14 never before, hospital survival lies in what we at Provena
15 call "system-ness" and that is maximizing efficiency and
16 costs savings by centralizing back office-type functions at
17 a corporate level so that resources can be focused on where
18 they matter most, in caring for our local communities.

19 We have some of that now, being part of
20 Provena, and we stand to gain more under the new
21 organization. In fact, work is already under way to expand
22 our charity care and financial assistance programs where
23 the need is great due in large part to the struggling
24 economy. There, to continue to ensure that we do not lose

1 sight of what's important to our local communities, will be
2 our wonderful and deeply-dedicated local Board of
3 Directors, which will operate as they currently do under
4 the new structure. Our local foundations will continue to
5 do the same, and our locally-raised dollars stay right
6 here, here to make a difference in the lives of our friends
7 and our neighbors.

8 This partnership -- the partnership will also
9 more strongly support our role as a leading employer in the
10 markets we serve, with our employees enjoying stability of
11 being part of a larger health system, with competitive pay
12 and benefits, career advancement opportunities, and a
13 faith-based culture of diversity, camaraderie, respect, and
14 compassion. Above all, our merger will preserve and
15 strengthen for generations to come the promise of our
16 founding Sisters here in Kankakee, made over a 100 years
17 ago. "Through our ministry, all in need will have healing
18 and hope in the spirit of Jesus Christ."

19 On behalf of the Provena family, I would
20 like to thank all who joined us today in person, or in
21 spirit, for their support of our new future, and also to
22 the Illinois Health Facilities and Services Review Board
23 for the opportunity to tell our story.

(FOLLOWING IS THE TESTIMONY PREVIOUSLY PRESENTED BY THOMAS NEHRING:)

11

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MR. NEHRING: Good morning. My name is Thomas Nehring, N-e-h-r-i-n-g. I serve as the System Senior Vice-President of Mission Services for Provena Health. I'm here today in support of the merger of Provena Health and Resurrection Healthcare.

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In my role with Provena, I have been responsible for cultural integration of mission and values, Catholic ministry identity, community benefit, advocacy and government relations, clinical and organizational ethics, leadership development and spirituality, and spiritual care services across our health system for the past 9 years. Previous to joining Provena, I did similar work for 10 years at Wheaton Franciscan Healthcare, another Catholic health system. During this time, I have also worked on

1 national committees and boards involved with Catholic
2 healthcare.

3 In my whole career within Catholic healthcare,
4 I have come to know that the one thing we are committed to
5 is to continue the healing ministry of Jesus Christ. Our
6 ministries work to bring alive the Gospel vision of justice
7 and peace. We answer God's call to foster healing, act
8 with compassion, and promote wellness for all persons and
9 communities, with special attention to our neighbors who
10 are poor, underserved and most vulnerable. By our service,
11 we strive to transform hurt into hope.

12 For more than 125 years, Provena Health
13 ministries have existed for the sole purpose of caring for
14 all, regardless of their ability to pay. It is a
15 commitment that is at the core of our mission, to build
16 communities of healing and hope by compassionately
17 responding to human need in the spirit of Jesus Christ. It
18 is how we concretely live out directive number three of the
19 Ethical and Religious Directives for Catholic Health Care
20 Services, given to us by the Bishops of the United States.
21 I quote, "In accord with its mission, Catholic healthcare
22 should distinguish itself by service to and advocacy for
23 those people whose social condition puts them at the
24 margins of our society and makes them particularly

1 vulnerable to discrimination; the poor; the uninsured and
2 the underinsured; children and the unborn; single parents;
3 the elderly; those with incurable diseases and chemical
4 dependency; racial minorities; immigrants and refugees. In
5 particular, the person with mental or physical
6 disabilities, regardless of the cause or severity, must be
7 treated as a unique person of incomparable worth, with the
8 same right to life and to adequate healthcare as all other
9 persons," end of quote. This is what we strive to do, and
10 today I must tell you that the needs of the poor and the
11 marginalized are greater than ever.

12 Our figures from 2010 detail that our service
13 resulted in a charitable impact upon our communities of
14 more than \$186 million for Provena Health. Nearly sixty
15 million of that was given away in free care at cost through
16 charitable assistance, which totaled over \$35 million, and
17 bad debts, which equaled nearly \$25 million. Sixty-two
18 percent of that \$186 million -- or \$114.5 million --
19 represented combined provisions of care not fully
20 reimbursed from State and Federal government's Medicaid and
21 Medicare programs. In addition, Provena contributed over
22 \$12 million in community benefit services, which are
23 specific programs and activities aimed at meeting
24 identified community health needs. Taken as a whole,

1 Provena Health's contributions on average represented more
2 than \$511,000 in charitable benefit each and every day of
3 2010.

4 Provena Health ministries in the greater
5 Kankakee community, including Provena St. Mary's Hospital,
6 Provena Fortin Villa Learning Center, Provena Heritage
7 Village, Provena Home Health, Provena Medical Group,
8 Provena Our Lady of Victory, and Provena St. Mary's Adult
9 Day Center, delivered a total 2010 charitable impact of
10 more than \$26 million, 28 percent of which -- or \$7.4
11 million -- was free care at cost, composed of charity care
12 and bad debt. And 70 percent of which -- or \$18.6
13 million -- represented combined provisions of care not
14 fully reimbursed from Medicaid and Medicare. In addition,
15 these ministries contributed over \$600,000 in community
16 benefit services. Taken as a whole, Provena's
17 contributions, on average, in the Kankakee communities
18 represented more than \$73,000 in charitable benefit each
19 and every day of 2010.

20 These amounts not only represent an enduring
21 commitment to serve all, regardless of their ability to
22 pay, but also underscore the critical role that Provena
23 ministries play in the communities we serve, especially
24 during these difficult economic times. We recognize that

1 among those we serve are often those most in need, and we
2 are privileged to have their trust, and we work daily to
3 ensure we continue to provide nationally-recognized, high
4 quality care and services to each and every individual who
5 comes through our doors.

6 I am pleased to submit into the record Provena
7 Health's 2010 Report to Our Communities, which details at a
8 much greater level our enduring commitment to serve all and
9 the charitable impact we deliver within the communities we
10 serve. As complexities within our nation's healthcare
11 system evolve, we are compelled to adapt and to innovate,
12 to preserve, strengthen and grow our ministry for the
13 benefit of the millions of people in Illinois who depend
14 upon us for care, and that is why we seek your approval for
15 our partnership and collaboration with Resurrection
16 Healthcare. Together as Catholic healthcare providers, we
17 will embrace the work that lies ahead to create a health
18 system that is available and accessible to everyone, a
19 health system that is health and prevention-oriented, one
20 that rewards quality, not quantity, one that is transparent
21 and consensus-driven, a healthcare system that is safe, one
22 that is effective and patient-centered, and one that
23 addresses health needs at all stages of life, from
24 conception through natural death.

1 Thank you.

3 MS. AVERY: Paula Simmons.

4 MS. SIMMONS: Mine also is the same as this
5 morning.

6 MS. AVERY: And that's your testimony? You're
7 not reading on behalf of anyone?

8 MS. SIMMONS: Correct.

9

10 (FOLLOWING IS THE TESTIMONY PREVIOUSLY PRESENTED BY PAULA
11 SIMMONS:)

12 MS. SIMMONS: Good morning. My name is Paula
13 Simmons, and I'm the Patient Care Manager for the Family
14 Birthing Unit at Provena St. Mary's.

15 After more than fifteen years of proud
16 service, I can tell you that Provena St. Mary's Hospital is
17 as dedicated to the growth and development of its more than
18 900 employees as it is to its providing the highest quality
19 care to the patient it is privileged to serve. I know
20 because my nursing career is the direct result of this
21 commitment.

22 I decided to become an obstetric nurse later
23 in life. I worked as an OB tech at Provena St. Mary's
24 while I was in nursing school and was offered a full-time

1 OB nursing position upon graduation. My career since then
2 has been a steady climb into a leadership role, with each
3 step along the way supported wholeheartedly not only by my
4 peers but by the organization as a whole.

5 When I felt like I had reached my potential at
6 the bedside and wanted additional responsibilities, my
7 director helped me to locate opportunities for advancement.
8 At around the same time, Provena St. Mary's was in the
9 midst of developing a cohort Bachelor of Science in Nursing
10 program with Olivet Nazarene University. In addition to
11 the convenience and comfort of attending class with my
12 co-workers right at the site at the hospital, I have been
13 able to take advantage of Provena's generous tuition
14 reimbursement program, which was one of the main factors in
15 my decision to pursue additional education, because I had
16 three children in college at the same time. I am now just
17 one year away from my degree and deeply thankful for the
18 opportunity Provena St. Mary's has provided me to further
19 develop my skills.

20 I know that dedication to career growth is not
21 unique to Provena St. Mary's. It's also apparent at our
22 Provena sister ministries and at Resurrection Healthcare as
23 well. A merger of our two systems will provide additional
24 resources to help develop our expert care teams in order to

1 best serve those who depend on us for care.

2 Thank you.

3

4 MS. AVERY: Amy Whitis.

5 MS. WHITIS: I'm submitting my testimony from
6 earlier.

7 MS. AVERY: Okay. Thank you.

8

9 (FOLLOWING IS THE TESTIMONY PREVIOUSLY PRESENTED BY AMY
10 WHITIS:)

11 MS. WHITIS: I'm Amy Whitis. I'm the Clinical
12 Education Coordinator at Provena St. Mary's.

13 It's no surprise to me that Provena St. Mary's
14 Hospital has twice been named a Workplace of Distinction by
15 Morehead Associates. The award recognizes organizations
16 that are dedicated to creating an engaged workforce that
17 provides safe, superior patient care. That has absolutely
18 been my experience. Those I work with at Provena St.
19 Mary's aren't my co-workers, they're my family. It takes a
20 special organization to create an environment like ours,
21 one that is equally dedicated to employee care as it is to
22 patient care.

23 Over my 15-year career, I have been able to
24 take advantage of skill development opportunities when I

1 decided to transition from the intensive care unit to my
2 current role in clinical education and tuition
3 reimbursement when pursuing my master's program. I've also
4 been the grateful recipient of mentoring from peers who
5 have been long-standing employees at Provena St. Mary's,
6 undoubtedly because they feel just as supported in their
7 careers as I do. In addition to competitive pay, the
8 opportunity I have to set aside money as part of my
9 retirement benefit, a portion of which is matched by
10 Provena, is a great relief. Financial counselors are also
11 on site regularly to help answer questions fellow employees
12 and I have about investments and other planning, and I've
13 found that counseling to be very helpful.

14 I know that being a part of a system has
15 allowed Provena St. Mary's Hospital to offer these
16 opportunities, and I'm confident that a merger with
17 Resurrection Health Care will allow more of the same. I
18 respectfully urge your approval of the merger application
19 and thank you for your consideration.

20

21 MS. AVERY: And then we have a new name Stacey
22 Harsy.

23 MS. HARSY: I'm Stacey Harsy, and I'm the
24 Director of the Manteno Dialysis Center. I'm writing in

1 support of the merger of Provena Health with Resurrection
2 Healthcare.

3 As Director of the Manteno Dialysis Center, I
4 have witnessed first-hand how collaborative partnerships
5 enhance the care we provide to our patients. One shining
6 example is the Dr. Breitenfield Quality Award that our
7 center received in 2009, which demonstrated how two
8 separate facilities can work together to raise the quality
9 standards for our community. After the Provena St. Mary's
10 Regional Dialysis Center won a similar award in 2007 and
11 2008, our facilities, which share similar resources in
12 physician and staff support, worked together to share best
13 practices to Improve outcomes for dialysis patients in both
14 facilities.

15 Merging with Resurrection will help to make
16 all ministries involved stronger in an era of great change
17 coming to healthcare. It will preserve our missions, which
18 put the community and the people within it at its center,
19 and allow us to provide even more for those we serve.

20 I urge the Board's approval of this
21 application. Thank you.

22 MS. AVERY: Thank you.

23 Michelle Schaper.

24 MS. SCHAPER: I will be submitting the same

1 six letters of support as I did this morning.

2 MS. AVERY: Okay. And we'll just read those
3 into the transcript for the record.

6 (FOLLOWING IS THE TESTIMONY PREVIOUSLY PRESENTED BY
7 MICHELLE SCHAPER:)

8 MS. SCHAPER: Good morning. My name is
9 Michelle Schaper, S-c-h-a-p-e-r, and I'm Senior Associate
10 from Provena Health's Public Relations and Marketing Team.
11 On behalf of Provena Health, I would like to sincerely
12 thank Ms. Avery, today's hearing officer; Ms. Olson
13 representing the Health Facilities and Services Review
14 Board; and Ms. Keim, court reporter, for their time and
15 efforts to coordinate today's public hearing.
