1 MR. MORADO: Good morning. My name is
2 Juan Morado. I'm the assistant general counsel for the
3 Illinois Health Facilities and Services Review Board.
4 Joining me today is the Board Chairman Dale Galassie.

5 MR. GALASSIE: Good morning.

6 MR. MORADO: Our purpose here today is to
7 hear testimony, and my purpose is to act as a hearing
8 officer and facilitator for Project 11-047,
9 Resurrection Medical Center Chicago.

10 As per the rules of the Illinois Health
11 Facilities and Services Review Board, I would like to
12 read a legal Notice into the record.

13 In accordance with the requirements of the
14 Illinois Health Facilities Planning Act, notice is given
15 of receipt and transfer, ownership of a hospital,
16 Project No. 11-047, Resurrection Medical Center Chicago.
17 The applicants are Resurrection Medical Center,
18 Provena Health, Resurrection Health Care Corporation,
19 and Cana Lakes Health Care. The applicants propose to
20 transfer to Cana Lakes Health Care ownership of a
21 360-bed hospital located at 7435 West Hawthorne,
22 Chicago. The project's cost is \$550,729,657.

23 A public hearing is to be held by the
24 Illinois Department of Public Health pursuant to the
25 Illinois Health Facilities Planning Act. The hearing is

1 open to the public and will afford an opportunity for
2 parties with interest to present written and/or verbal
3 comment relevant to the project. All allegations or
4 assertions should be relevant to the need for the
5 proposed project and be supported with two copies of
6 documentation, printed or typed, on paper size
7 8-1/2 by 11.

8 The public hearing will take place pursuant
9 to 1130.910. The hearing is scheduled for September
10 21st, 2011 at 10:00 a.m., located at Oriole Park,
11 5430 North Olcott Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, 60656.

12 Consideration by the State Board has been
13 tentatively scheduled for the October 12th and 13th,
14 2011 State Board meeting. Any person wanting to submit
15 written comments on this project must submit these
16 comments by 9:00 a.m. September 22nd, 2011.

17 That's the end of the legal Notice.

18 If you have not done so, please be sure to
19 sign in and use the appropriate registration forms if
20 you are going to be giving testimony. There are two
21 testimony forms, one for individuals in support of the
22 project and one for individuals in opposition of the
23 project.

24 To ensure that the Illinois Health
25 Facilities and Services Review Board's public hearings

1 protect the privacy and maintain the confidentiality of
2 an individual's health information, covered entities, as
3 defined by the Health Insurance Portability Act of 1996,
4 such as facilities, hospital providers, health plans,
5 and health care clearinghouses, submitting oral or
6 written testimony that disclose protected health
7 information of individuals shall have a valid written
8 authorization from that individual. The authorization
9 shall allow the covered entity to share the individual's
10 protected health information at this hearing.

11 For those of you who came with prepared
12 written text, you may submit the written testimony
13 without giving an oral presentation. However, if you
14 choose to give oral testimony, please be as brief as
15 possible. I ask that you limit your testimony to two
16 to three minutes. After you have concluded your
17 remarks, please provide me with two copies. Please,
18 prior to giving your remarks today, give the court
19 reporter the spelling of your complete name.
20 Individuals providing oral testimony will be called in
21 order according to sign-in. Please hold any questions
22 regarding today's proceedings until everyone has had an
23 opportunity to present.

24 We're going to begin with the
25 representatives of the applicants and I have

1 Mr. John Baird.

2 MR. BAIRD: I am John Baird. B-a-i-r-d.

3 Good morning. I'm the Executive Vice
4 President and Chief Executive Officer of Resurrection
5 Medical Center. My name is John Baird.

6 Resurrection Medical Center is an
7 award-winning, full-service medical center located on
8 the northwest side of Chicago. It's the nearest
9 hospital to O'Hare and serves neighborhoods of Edison
10 Park, Jefferson Park, Edgebrook, Belmont, and
11 Norwood Park.

12 Resurrection Medical Center is part of the
13 system of hospitals and other health care facilities
14 known as Resurrection Health Care. Resurrection Health
15 Care is a Catholic health care system co-sponsored by
16 the Sisters of the Resurrection and the Sisters of the
17 Holy Family of Nazareth.

18 Resurrection Health Care Corporation and
19 Provena Health are proposing a merger of the two systems
20 that will better position the combined new Ministry's
21 hospitals, long-term care facilities, outpatient
22 centers, and other programs and facilities to continue
23 to serve the patients and community that have
24 traditionally looked to those facilities for care.
25 Details on this decision to merge and structure of the

1 transaction are included in the Certificate of Need
2 Applications filed in July of 2011.

3 After the merger, Resurrection Medical
4 Center will continue to operate as a Catholic facility,
5 consistent with the ethical directives for Catholic
6 health care. We will continue to operate as a general
7 acute-care hospital and no change in our license will
8 be required. We do not expect any hospital program,
9 service, or staffing changes to occur as a result of
10 this merger.

11 Our hospital's generous financial assistance
12 policy was compared, side-by-side, with the financial
13 assistance policy of Provena hospitals and we've jointly
14 developed a comprehensive new financial assistance
15 policy for the proposed new Ministry that is even more
16 generous. Our policy is patient and family centered and
17 appropriately identifies patients that are unable to pay
18 for medically necessary services. It is also our goal
19 to provide accessible and effective health services
20 while maintaining our fiscal viability. Efforts will
21 be made to effectively communicate the availability
22 of financial assistance to patients, families, and
23 communities we serve. Our hospital will continue to
24 follow the Illinois Hospital Uninsured Patient Discount
25 Act, the Illinois Fair Patient Billing Act, and all

1 other applicable laws relating to the provision of care
2 to the underserved.

3 In summary, this proposed merger will enable
4 the hospital and its current and new sister facilities
5 to strengthen access to high-quality Catholic health
6 care, improve our combined financial viability, enhance
7 clinical capabilities, improve employee and medical
8 staff satisfaction, and importantly, positions the new
9 health care system for innovation and adaptation under
10 health care reform.

11 Thank you for this opportunity to explain
12 the importance and value to the community of this
13 proposed merger.

14 MR. GALASSIE: Thank you for your time.

15 MR. BAIRD: Thank you.

16 MR. MORADO: Next up, we have Sister
17 Hedwig Kuczynski.

18 SISTER KUCZYNSKI: My last name is
19 K-u-c-z-y-n-s-k-i.

20 I am Sister Hedwig Kuczynski, a member of
21 the Religious Congregation of the Sisters of the
22 Resurrection and I serve on the Sponsorship Board of
23 Resurrection Health Care.

24 I am speaking today on behalf of my own
25 Congregation as well as the cosponsors of Resurrection

1 Health Care, the Sisters of the Holy Family of Nazareth,
2 and the Member Body of Provena Health, the Franciscan
3 Sisters of the Sacred Heart, the Servants of the Holy
4 Heart of Mary, and the Sisters of Mercy of the Americas.

5 I would like to welcome all of you who have
6 joined us here today and express my sincere appreciation
7 to the Illinois Health Facilities and Services Review
8 Board for the conscientious and hard work done to enable
9 this hearing to take place in a timely and organized
10 fashion.

11 I am representing the five communities of
12 women religious who, in faith and hope, seek the
13 approval of the Illinois Health Facilities and Services
14 Review Board to form a new Catholic health Ministry to
15 serve the citizens of Illinois through a merger of
16 Provena Health and Resurrection Health Care Corporation
17 and our combined hospitals and other care facilities and
18 providers.

19 As individual health systems, Provena Health
20 and Resurrection Health Care have long provided
21 compassionate healing to those in need. In keeping with
22 the true spirit of the courageous Sisters who came
23 before us, ours has been ministries deeply focused on
24 quality care for all, regardless of one's ability to
25 pay.

1 Now as we anticipate health reform and the
2 sweeping changes that will transform the delivery of
3 care as we have come to know it, we are keenly aware
4 that the key to sustaining and growing our
5 person-centered mission lies in the strength of enduring
6 partnerships we forge today.

7 Jointly rooted in the traditions of Catholic
8 health care, the new Ministry would be distinguished by
9 an ability to deliver quality care across the continuum,
10 from broad and complementary bases of leading-edge
11 hospitals and other care locations and to link with
12 committed physician networks. From a foundation steeped
13 in a shared heritage and set of values, the new Ministry
14 would give rise to an enormous potential to truly
15 improve the wellbeing of generations of Illinois
16 residents to come.

17 With a dedicated and talented combined
18 team of nearly 5000 physicians, both employed and
19 independent, supported by over 22,000 employees, the
20 new Ministry will play an important role in the economic
21 vitality of the communities in which we serve, through
22 our hospitals and other facilities. Above all, our
23 partnership will remain true to the hallmarks of our
24 Catholic identity, promoting and protecting the dignity
25 of every individual, from conception to death, caring

1 for the poor and vulnerable, and properly stewarding
2 our precious people and financial resources.

3 Before I conclude, I would like to also
4 enter into the record a letter of support from His
5 Excellency, Francis Cardinal George, Archbishop of
6 Chicago. In his letter he says, in part, quote:

7 "I am grateful for the willingness of our
8 state's premier Catholic providers to collaborate in
9 order to meet the current challenges of health care. As
10 they do now, the combined systems will operate without
11 any restrictive admissions policies related to race,
12 ethnic background, religion, payment source, or any
13 other factor. The new system will continue to admit
14 Medicare and Medicaid recipients and to care for those
15 patients in need of charity care. This merger has my
16 full support."

17 In conclusion, the combination of Provena
18 Health and Resurrection Health Care hospitals and other
19 care facilities and providers will strengthen and expand
20 access to an exceptional tradition of quality care and
21 service millions of Illinois residents who have come to
22 know and depend upon for more than a century. On behalf
23 of the religious those communities are sponsoring the
24 applications before you, we prayerfully request your
25 approval and thank you.

1 MR. GALASSIE: Thank you.

2 MR. MORADO: Thank you

3 Next we have Bob Bulger.

4 MR. BULGER: Good afternoon. My name is
5 Bob Bulger, B-u-l-g-e-r. I'm the Senior Vice President
6 of Mission for Resurrection Health Care. This oral
7 testimony that I'll present is a small portion of my
8 total testimony and I will, respectfully, submit my
9 entire testimony in written form for the record.

10 Recent statistics show that Resurrection
11 Health Care delivered a total community benefit of
12 over \$206 million. For the 2010 year, Resurrection
13 Medical Center delivered a total community benefit of
14 \$25.6 million, \$22.4 million of which represented
15 charity care at cost, and \$3.5 million of which
16 represented bad debt at cost. The remaining \$19.7
17 million represented activities, including donations,
18 volunteer services, language assistance, educational
19 programs, unpaid costs of government-sponsored care,
20 research, and subsidized health services. These numbers
21 include all reportable contributions required by the
22 Illinois Community Benefits Act.

23 In addition, I'm also pleased to submit into
24 the record Resurrection Health Care's 2010 Community
25 Report which highlights more details and personal

1 testimonies about our commitment to providing
2 compassionate, family-centered care to everyone in our
3 communities.

4 Thank you very much.

5 MR. GALASSIE: Thank you.

6 MR. MORADO: Thank you.

7 Finally, we have Mr. Crawford.

8 MR. CRAWFORD: Thank you very much.

9 I'd like to thank again Mr. Galassie and
10 Mr. Morado for coming out and presiding over this
11 hearing. I know you've been to other ones as well, and
12 I just want to thank you for your fairness and your
13 understanding process and what I think has been a
14 mutually respectful and productive process. I'm going
15 to also keep my comments very short.

16 I'm going to read the names of some letters
17 of support that we have received for this project. The
18 first is from Dr. Victor P. Mokarry, who's president of
19 the Resurrection medical staff. He's written in support
20 of the project.

21 The second is from Deborah Marinoff who's
22 an employee at Resurrection Medical Center and she has
23 written in support of the project.

24 Marie Bertsch who's a resident of the
25 Resurrection retirement community, which is located near

1 Resurrection Medical Center, has written a letter of
2 support for the project.

3 I have a letter of support for the project
4 from Alderman Mary O'Connor of the 41st Ward, is the
5 ward that the hospital sits in.

6 I have a letter of support from
7 Sandra O. Lightfoot who is the Regional Director of
8 Health Initiatives and Patient Navigation Services for
9 the American Cancer Society of the Chicago region.

10 I have a letter of support from
11 Betty Henneman who's the Clerk of the City of Park
12 Ridge.

13 A letter of support from Peter N. Silvestri
14 who's Cook County Commissioner of the 9th District and
15 also president of the Village of Elmwood Park.

16 I have a letter of support from
17 David McNaughton, Commander of the 16th District of the
18 Chicago Police Department.

19 I have a letter of support from
20 Melissa Panizzi and she is with the Edison Park Chamber
21 of Commerce, she is the executive director.

22 I have a letter from Fire Chief Kevin
23 Stenson of the Norwood Park Fire Protection District.

24 I have a letter of support from Gail Haller,
25 who is the executive director of the Park Ridge Chamber

1 of Commerce.

2 I have a letter of support from Mr. Matthew
3 Toles, who's vice president of PNC Bank and also a board
4 member at Resurrection Medical Center.

5 A letter of support from Patricia Ahern who
6 is the president and CEO of Rainbow Hospice & Palliative
7 Care.

8 A letter of support from Dr. Lynne Saccaro
9 who's the president and principal of Resurrection
10 College Prep High School.

11 A letter of support from Rev. James J.
12 O'Brian from St. Monica Parish.

13 A letter of support from Sen. Dan Kotowski,
14 state senator of the 33rd District.

15 A letter of support from Joanne Moore who is
16 with the Polish Healthy Lifestyles Outreach Project and
17 works with Resurrection Medical Center.

18 Finally, I have a letter of support -- I'm
19 going to sort through this paper before I turn it in,
20 from Guy Wiebking, who is the CEO -- when he wrote the
21 letter was the CEO of Provena Health Care and is
22 co-signed by Sandra Bruce, CEO of Resurrection Health
23 Care. Since the time that letter was written,
24 Ms. Bruce has been named the CEO of the combined entity,
25 should this project go forward, and Mr. Wiebking would

1 become the chairman of the board. I think in our
2 previous hearing that had not yet been decided, but has
3 recently been decided.

4 Thank you very much.

5 MR. MORANDO: Thank you.

6 MR. GALASSIE: Thank you.

7 MR. MORANDO: Is there anyone who wishes to
8 testify who has not had an opportunity?

9 Is there anyone who has testified that
10 wishes to provide additional testimony at this time?

11 I'd like to remind everyone to please submit
12 your written comments, which you've done. Please note
13 that this project is tentatively scheduled for
14 consideration by the State Board at its October 12th and
15 13th meeting. The meeting location has been confirmed,
16 it will be at the Bolingbrook Country Club.

17 Unfortunately, I do not have an address at this time,
18 but it is listed on our website. You can find it at
19 www.hfsrb.illinois.gov. The information is already
20 posted, as I said, and the public will have until
21 9:00 a.m. September 22nd to submit written comments
22 pertaining to this project. Comments can be sent to the

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
