The need for psychiatric and addiction medicine care is great in our community. Over the last year, The Pavilion turned away 711 patients they were unable to accommodate due to the lack of bed capacity. If patients are not able to be treated in our community they have to travel 2-3 hours away to receive care. When patients are not able to receive care locally, their family are not able to participate in treatment due to distance and the family involvement component to treatment is critical.

It seems to me if people in crisis are seeking the help they need, we should also do our very best to accommodate them so they can be healthy, productive members of our community and society as a whole. 

Dear Mr. Sheehy,

I definitely support the expansion of The Pavilion to increase both and adult and youth capacities – both for mental health and addiction services.

When I need to refer patients for inpatient care I prefer to do it locally however, when our local hospital is full patients must be referred outside of our community. This has created problems both in the safety and placement of my patients as well as my inability to provide input to the treatment team prior to and access to patients after hospitalization.

Additionally, it is not appropriate to send my patients to another hospital through an Emergency Room which is not staffed with Mental Health providers.

There is a growing need for community inpatient psychiatric services both inpatient and outpatient resources as evidenced by the lack of available bed space.

This is compounded by the tight structure of the insurance plans available in Central Illinois and the tight restriction of the HMO plans many of my patients have as the Pavilion is their preferred provider.


