When we moved to Monarch Landing three years ago, we came with the expectation of seeing a building called the Renaissance Center being built directly across the way from our Cottonwood Court wing. We would be able to view the construction of this healthcare facility from our living room window. This never happened because Mr. Erickson went into bankruptcy and sold Monarch Landing to David Reis, who assured us that a Healthcare Center would be built to serve the same purpose as the Renaissance Center would have served.

We moved to Monarch Landing trusting that this facility will be in operation to serve us if and when we come to need care that we cannot provide each other or, someday, cannot provide for ourselves alone. This Healthcare Center was one of the main reasons we moved to Monarch Landing because it gave us a strong sense of security – that we would be safe and cared for in our very senior years with the highest quality of primary medical care along with continual services for our social, emotional, physical and spiritual well-being. We were assured there would be direct accessibility for us as a couple to all of these services – all offered under one roof so that if one of us needed to live in the Healthcare Center, the spouse would have an easy means of travel to his or her loved one on the same campus.
