Dear Mr. Roberts,

I am writing this letter in response to the intent to close Maryville Behavioral Health's Hospital in June 15, 2014. As stated in Maryville's letter, Maryville will close 125 licensed acute mental illness beds and has inquired as to whether Streamwood Behavioral Healthcare System (SBHS) has the capacity to accommodate a portion or all of the population that Maryville currently serves upon closure. SBHS does have the capacity, upon the closure of Maryville, to treat the patient population of Maryville. SBHS has been providing mental health treatment to the Chicagoland community and the state of Illinois since 1991. We are dedicated to offering services that provide HOPE and meet the ever changing emotional and behavioral healthcare needs of children, adolescents, young adults and their families.

We have the unique designation of being the first free-standing child, adolescent and young adult behavioral healthcare facility in the state of Illinois. We currently have 162 licensed child and adolescent beds. Our sole focus on child, adolescent and young adult mental health care allows us to provide full continuum of care, including: Inpatient Stabilization, Partial Hospitalization Day Treatment, Outpatient Assessment and Treatment, Therapeutic Day School.

We are currently in the position to accommodate the patients at our facility subject to our admission criteria. We are available to you as you wind down your operations to coordinate patient transfers and transition of care.

Dear Mr. Roberts,

We received your letter dated March 21, 2014 notifying us of your plan to submit a certificate of need application to discontinue Maryville Behavioral Health Hospital (MBHH). Additionally, you requested a response advising whether we have the capacity to accommodate a portion or all of your patients, and whether any restrictions or limitations preclude your facility's provision of services to residents of the service area. Please consider this letter our response to your March 21st request.

Centegra Health System is currently the only provider of the inpatient Acute Mental Illness (AMI) Category of Service in Planning Area 8 A-10 and provides inpatient services to the adult population. We have submitted two CON applications (#14-003 and #14-004) proposing to relocate our acute mental illness category of service from Centegra Specialty Hospital – Woodstock to Centegra Hospital – Woodstock. The proposed unit at Centegra Hospital – Woodstock will fully meet the calculated bed need of 34 AMI beds for the planning area and will provide services to the adult population.

Our team utilized COMPdata to conduct an analysis of Maryville Behavioral Health Hospital's cases. The analysis shows that in calendar year 2012 and 2013, there were 37 and 27 cases respectively from McHenry County Planning Area 8 A-10 that went to MBHH. Given that MBHH specializes in adolescent care and our units admit patients who are at least 18 years old, we would have only been able to accommodate nine cases in 2012 and six cases in 2013. Should your application to discontinue MBHH be approved, we would be able to accommodate your patients from our planning area who are over the age of 18.
