SERVICES TO BE REMOVED FROM ROCKFORD MEMORIAL HOSPITAL & ROCKTON AVENUE SERVICES AND TRANSFERRED TO RIVERSIDE

- The Level 1 Trauma Center will be transferred to the Riverside Campus
- The Cardiac Cath Lab will be transferred to the Riverside Campus
- The Emergency Department will lose 14 examination rooms (31 current rooms down to 17) – a 45% reduction
- The Intensive Care Unit will be reduced from 31 current beds down to 4 beds
- Operating Rooms will be reduced from 14 to 4
- Cardiac and urological surgeries will be discontinued at Rockton and available only at Riverside
- General radiology, Cat Scans, MRI, and ultrasound services will be continued but with reduced availability/scheduling opportunities
- The Gastroenterology I lab will be moved to the Riverside site
- All obstetrics and pediatric hospital services will be moved to Riverside
- The NICU (neonatal intensive care unit) will be moved to the Riverside site
- All nuclear medicine services will be moved to Riverside, including PET Scans (even though cancer care will be continue to be provided at Rockton)
- The laboratory currently located in the Rockford Clinic Building will be incorporated into the RMH main laboratory

Potential Outcomes and Implications of the Changes (in no particular order)

- There will be no Level 1 trauma center to serve Rockford's West side, central City, or near East side. OSF St. Anthony Hospital at East State and Roxbury is the only other Level 1 trauma center in the region. A Level 1 trauma center means there is a comprehensive team of trauma surgeons, an anesthesiologist, and medical and surgical specialists and support staff available *on site* 24/7/365 to handle serious, life-threatening events such as traumatic head and body injuries due to automobile, workplace, and other accidents, gunshot wounds, and acute cardiovascular events such as heart attack, aneurysm and stroke.
- Relocating the Level 1 trauma center to Riverside will put two Level 1 trauma centers within approximately four miles of each other on the far East side while leaving the entire Western region of Winnebago County without these critical services.

- The loss of the cardiac cath lab means that heart attack and stroke patients will have to be transported to SwedishAmerican, OSF, or the Riverside facility in order to receive the best and most timely diagnostic and intervention services in situations in which time is critical to survival and optimum outcomes.
- Reducing Rockford Memorial's emergency room beds by 45% will cause long delays for patients needing emergency care. RMH already has extended waits for emergency room care and the loss of beds will only exacerbate the situation.
- MercyRockford's decision to essentially gut the Rockton Avenue "campus" and relocate the most critical services to the new Riverside facility is another loss of essential services for West side residents, including many of the City's most vulnerable and marginalized citizens.
- The increased transport times to the new Riverside facility for a large number of critical services will strain the City's EMS services. Ambulances will have to travel longer distances (including to SwedishAmerican & OSF) which will increase out of service times and disrupt coverage for neighborhoods, particularly those serving the West side and central City.
- The Riverside facility is not on a bus line. Even though MercyRockford intends to implement a shuttle service, this places yet another burden on West side residents' access to medical services or to visit children and family members who are hospitalized at Riverside
- The Convenient Care clinic will be incorporated into the Rockford Memorial Hospital emergency department area which already is overburdened.



As one of the architects of the Chicago Trauma Network and former head of the trauma service at Advocate Christ Medical Center in Oak Lawn, I have worked for decades to impress on communities the importance of maintaining an organized trauma system.

Enclosed are slides from a presentation I was recently asked to give to Rockford residents concerned about MercyRockford's plan to move its Level 1 Trauma Center out of Rockford's West Side.

Titled "Trauma Systems: Right patient to the right place at the right time," the presentation defines Level I Trauma Centers and emergency rooms, notes key distinctions between the two, considers the current state of the Region 1 trauma system and assesses how it can be improved.

I was invited to help educate residents from the West Side of Rockford about how trauma care is set up now in Rockford and how it could change if MercyRockford's proposal is approved by the Illinois Health Facilities and Services Review Board.

As I prepared for this presentation and reviewed the applications, I found significant concerns that must be addressed before any decisions are made on these projects. Critical questions to answer include:

1. Will moving trauma care further east adversely impact trauma outcomes?
2. What is the impact on western sections of the region (e.g., Seward, Pecatonica)?
3. Has the Region 1 Trauma/EMS Committee weighed in on this?

TRAUMA SYSTEMS

Right patient to the right place in the
right time

TRAUMA SYSTEMS

- ▣ First trauma center in the world established at Cook County Hospital in 1966
- ▣ First trauma system in the world established in Illinois in 1971
 - Architect was Dr. David Boyd
 - Centers designated by a committee without a verification visit
 - No legislative mandate for patients to be taken to specific centers

TRAUMA SYSTEMS

- ▣ **Current Illinois** trauma system established in 1989
- ▣ Patients mandated to go to specific center based on
 - ▣ Level of injury
 - ▣ Geographic location relative to trauma centers
 - ▣ Regional (local) protocols
- ▣ Centers designated after verification visits by IDPH

TRAUMA SYSTEMS

- ▣ Estimated up to 50% of trauma deaths that occur are preventable in absence of a trauma network
- ▣ Trauma systems reduce preventable trauma deaths to 5%
- ▣ Goals of an organized trauma system
 - ▣ Elimination of preventable deaths
 - ▣ Return patient to home in best possible functional state

RIGHT PATIENT

- ▣ **Mandatory** field triage criteria determined by IDPH (ACS)
- ▣ Modified at local level by Trauma/EMS Committee
- ▣ In Region I about 2500 - 3000 trauma admissions/year
- ▣ No differential criteria - patient meeting triage criteria goes to nearest trauma center

RIGHT PATIENT

- ▣ **Criteria** may be physiologic, anatomic or mechanism
- ▣ Physiologic refers to alterations in vital signs (abnormal BP, HR, GCS)
- ▣ Anatomic means specific location of injury (penetrating torso trauma, near or total amputations, spinal cord deficit)
- ▣ Mechanism indicates high energy incident (MVC \geq 30 MPH, fall \geq 20 feet, etc.)

RIGHT PLACE

- ▣ **Trauma centers** are staffed and equipped to meet the needs of trauma patients
- ▣ **Level I centers** can initiate surgery on a minute's notice
 - ▣ **Inhouse** trauma surgeon
 - ▣ **Inhouse** anesthesiologist
 - ▣ **Inhouse** operating room personnel
 - ▣ **Variety** of surgical specialists available in a timely fashion

RIGHT PLACE

- ▣ **Level II centers** can initiate surgery in an acceptable time frame
 - ▣ **Inhouse** emergency medicine physicians
 - ▣ **Trauma surgeon, anesthesiology, operating room personnel** available in 30 minute time frame from home

RIGHT TIME

- ▣ **Ideal trauma system does not direct EMS on destination for patients**
 - ▣ Is patient seriously injured enough to require a trauma center
 - ▣ Field personnel determine which center they can get to the fastest
 - ▣ Bypassing non-designated hospitals results in longer transports but improved outcomes

RIGHT TIME


- ▣ **Unknown if there is a transport time that eliminates the advantage of bypassing nearest hospital**
 - ▣ Length of time at which outcomes begin to deteriorate is unknown
 - ▣ Northwestern study showed 15% higher mortality rate with torso gunshot wound in shock that were more than 5 miles from trauma center - THIS HAS NOT BEEN DUPLICATED!

RIGHT TIME

- ▣ Logic says the longer it takes you to get to definitive treatment the worse your outcome should be
- ▣ The key determinant in trauma outcomes is the amount of time to control life-threatening injuries (i.e., time to surgical intervention)


REGION I QUESTIONS

- ▣ Will moving trauma care further east adversely impact trauma outcomes?
 - ▣ Difference in transport times 10 minutes by ground and 3 minutes by air
 - ▣ Need location of trauma incidents, mode of transport and travel times



REGION I QUESTIONS

- ▣ What's the impact on western sections of region?
 - Lower trauma prevalence
 - Impact of air transport



REGION I QUESTIONS

- ▣ Data to be collected
 - Trauma incidents by location, mechanism and physiologic status of patients
 - Transport times
 - Transport modes
- ▣ Impact of change must be assessed with this information by Region I Trauma/EMS Committee to determine advisability
 - Possible adverse outcomes
 - Additional expense

SUMMARY

- ▣ Unique aspect of Illinois Trauma System is regional control
- ▣ Quality care can only be delivered with a coordinated trauma network and agreement on the part of all key stakeholders
- ▣ Ultimate goal is saving lives and preventing disability

Dear Ms. Avery and Board Members:

Having served on the Board of Directors for Crusader Clinic (FQHC serving the uninsured and under-insured of the Rock River Valley) for 6 years and as Chair of the Board for 2 years, I am well aware of the needs of the patient population of the west side of Rockford, including the area around Rockford Memorial Hospital. Based on that experience, my own background as a Corporate VP of Trinity (now Trinity-Unity Point) Health System in the Quad Cities, and my review of the applications noted above, I have the following grave concerns about the potential consequences of granting the above referenced CON's.

1. The establishment of the Riverside hospital site would make it the 4th full service hospital in the Winnebago/Boone county area. Even though its addition would reduce the total number of beds available in the region, it would still represent a duplication of services and the overhead cost of equipment and personnel to provide them. It seems to me that this scenario would defeat any good that could come from increased competition among the local providers.

2. The move of OB, Pediatrics, cancer treatment, cardiac care, the NICU, and the trauma center to the extreme eastern edge of the county will place an additional burden on both Swedish American and OSF-St. Anthony hospitals. Their geographic proximity would lead many of patients from the west side to seek such services at either of the nearer facilities. Many of these patients are either uninsured or on Medicaid. Swedish American, in particular, already has a high percentage of Medicaid patients. With the reimbursement rate as low and as slow as it is, additional patients in this category will further challenge the cash flow position of Swedes. Further, transportation for persons to the East Riverside site would be difficult for both patients and families. The same could be said for


patients needing cardiac services, the NICU, or trauma services which are also to be transferred to the Riverside campus.

3. I question the need for a level I Trauma Center at the Riverside Campus. (Given the population base and with the fact that such services are currently available at OSF-St. Anthony's, two such centers are not needed in the area.) If there is a need, the rate of violence on the west side of Rockford would suggest that the retention of the Rockton site would be the more appropriate location for such services.

4. Finally, having gone through a process of consolidation of services in the Quad Cities (again because of a merger of health systems), I do not believe that it will be possible for Mercy Rockford to maintain two campuses that provide basic inpatient services. The cost of equipment and personnel militate against such duplication. If and when this happens, the west side of Rockford will again be the loser.

For these reasons, I wish to register my opposition to the granting of the Certificates of Need for which Rockford Mercy Health System has applied.
