

Dear Sister Catherine:

This letter is to confirm what I said to you verbally. I have no objection to the sale of the Maryville Behavioral Health Hospital.

The Vicar for Canonical Services for the Archdiocese of Chicago, the Very Rev. Daniel A. Smilanic, JCD, concurs with the determination of the Rev. Msgr. Patrick Lagges, JCD, that there is no evidence that Maryville is a Public Juridic Person, that the goods of Maryville are ecclesiastical goods and that the goods of Maryville are not stable patrimony.

The Board of Trustees of Maryville has given its consent to this sale.

The original funds to purchase the hospital were donated to Maryville by a family foundation. The hospital was intended to augment the core mission of Maryville, which is to serve children and families, particularly children who are at-risk, children who are poor and children who are marginalized. The money from the sale of the property is to be used to fund the pension program of those who worked for the core mission of Maryville and to support further the core mission of Maryville. I find that the intention of the original donors has been respected and fulfilled.

As Archbishop of Chicago, this document constitutes my canonical *nihil obstat* to the sale of the Maryville Behavioral Health Hospital.
