**CHILD WELFARE ASSOCIATE SPECIALIST - 07216**

Monthly Salary Range: \$3969 - \$5913

General duties: A Child Welfare Associate Specialist performs beginning level professional casework intervention/case management duties in the Department of Children and Family Services related to families in need of child welfare services or children who have been abused or neglected; receives training in child welfare services, casework, counseling and intervention techniques and applicable laws, rules and regulations and carries a progressively larger caseload. As a beginning level specialist in: Casework, interviews clients and other professional personnel to obtain the necessary information for an assessment of the conditions, needs, and issues to engage the clients in the development of a specific service plan; Resources, identifies service resource needs; Adoptions, performs professional adoptive services involving the application of social work principles and theory, particularly concentrating on the formulation of permanency plans for children with emphasis on adoption planning; the Shelter Care Program, assesses the needs, behaviors and desires of children in shelter care; Licensing, completes a detailed licensing study of assigned care facilities (e.g., child welfare facilities, group homes, foster homes, adoptive homes); the State Central Registry, provides telephone coverage of a state-wide toll free number for reporting cases of alleged child abuse and/or neglect; may perform beginning duties equivalent to those listed above but in a specialized unit. A Child Welfare Associate Specialist participates in and completes agency sponsored training programs. Duties performed are subject to close guidance and review of the supervisor or a more experienced specialist.

Applicants meeting these stated requirements will receive a grade in the highest category:

Training and Experience: Requires: 1) Preferably requires a master's degree in social work from a college with a program approved by the Council on Social Work Education; or 2) Master's degree from an accredited college or university in a related human service field, such as psychology, mental health counseling, rehabilitation counseling, pastoral counseling, marriage and family therapy, or human services; or 3) Bachelor's degree in social work from a college with a program approved by the Council on Social Work Education; or 4) Bachelor's degree from an accredited university in a related human service field, such as psychology, mental health counseling, rehabilitation counseling, pastoral counseling, marriage and family therapy or human services plus one year of directly related professional casework/case management experience related to family preservation, family reunification, adoption, youth development, counseling and advocacy services, or a related field. Requires possession of a valid driver's license, daily access to an automobile, and proof of vehicle insurance. Requires physical, visual and auditory ability to carry out assigned duties. Requires the ability to satisfactorily pass an in-depth background check as a condition for employment.
