General duties: An Educator teaches preschool, school age and adult institutional residents standard or special educational subjects that usually correspond to kindergarten, elementary or secondary levels of education. The Educator will, depending on area of assignment, be required to apply teaching skills that transcend those normally utilized in teaching standard course work by adapting and revising standard practices or specialized teaching techniques to meet the specific needs of the type of student enrolled in the program.

The requirements for a minimal passing grade are as follows:

Training and Experience: Requires Illinois Professional Educator License (PEL) in the area of specialization appropriate to the subject matter and type of students.

All individuals seeking a certificated position with the Department of Corrections should note that Public Act 88-0102 amended the School Code to include the following: An applicant, who fails to provide requested employment history for a certificated position used by a school district, may be guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.

**OPTION A:**

“Grade” must show as authorized to teach age ranges of K through 9 (Examples: Middle School Grade 6 through Grade 8; Kindergarten through Grade 9; Junior HS Grade 5 through Grade 8; Middle School Grade 5 through Grade 8; Kindergarten through Grade 12; Kindergarten through Grade 4).

**OPTION B/SSB:**

“Grade” must show as authorized to teach age ranges of 9 through 12 (Examples: Senior HS Grade 9 through Grade 12; Kindergarten through Grade 12).

**OPTION C/BRC/MCC:**

“Grade” must show as authorized to teach age ranges of Preschool through age 21 (Examples: Prekindergarten through Grade 9; Grade 6 through Age 21); applicant must have one of following “special needs” subjects identified under “Description” (Examples of “special needs”: Learning Behavior Specialist I, Learning Disabilities, Mental Retardation, Social/Emotional Disorders, etc.).

**OPTION D/SSD:**

ELS endorsed for transitional bilingual educator with bilingual language and applicable grade-level endorsements.

**OPTION E/SSE:**

“Grade” must show as authorized to teach age ranges of K through 12 (Examples: Middle School Grade 6 through Grade 8; Kindergarten through Grade 9; Junior HS Grade 5 through Grade 8; Middle School Grade 5 through Grade 8; Kindergarten through Grade 12; Kindergarten through Grade 4; Senior HS Grade 9 through Grade 12; Kindergarten through Grade 12).

Option BRC – Braille: At the time of the job interview, the eligible will be required to exhibit the ability to read and interpret Braille. Failure to exhibit this ability will result in disqualification for this option.

Option MCC – Manual Communication: At the time of the job interview, the eligible will be required to exhibit the ability to communicate effectively with the deaf by utilizing American Sign Language concepts and manual communication skills. Failure to exhibit this ability will result in disqualification for this option.

Option SSB, SSD, SSE - Spanish Speaking: At the time of the job interview, the eligible will be required to exhibit the ability to understand and speak Spanish and English fluently. Failure to exhibit this ability will result in disqualification for this option.
