Register Your Project Widget

The Serving Those Who Served Widget will be available on all partners' websites. This widget will allow project planners to list their projects and recruit additional volunteers if needed. It is important to note that the serving those who served widget is made available through **All For Good**. To register a project you will need to set up an account with them. This will allow volunteers to see your project and get in contact with you to get involved. You are responsible for any screening, training, and tracking of those volunteers as based on your organizations standards.

To register a project: Click the post an opportunity button.

Register your organization or sign in if you already have an account.

Once you are signed in, click "opportunities" and then "create an opportunity"

Complete the form and be sure to select "Illinois Veterans Day of Service" under "Is this opportunity associated with a day of service or disaster event?"

Click "create," and you are done!

Tips

- Call in to the informational webinar/call
- Utilize Social Media
- Send out a Save the Date for your project
- Start early- this is a great way to get organized, and be prepared to meet all the project goals and needs.
- Determine the goals of the project, decide what materials may be needed, create a deadline to have all materials accounted for, decide how many people it may take to implement.
- It may be helpful to create groups to break up the work in sections, organization is key
- Have monthly meetings to track progress, and ensure deadlines are being met
- Reach out to local media and organizations, be excited and let it show in your media and press releases.
